Units of Study

The chart below outlines the units of study for Algebra II and possible major assignments or field trips that could be used to enhance student learning or solidify mastery of standards in each unit. This chart is not inclusive of every assignment for Algebra II, as additional or different assignments may be created based on the needs of students. Specific details for major assignments will be shared with students and parents or legal guardians as the standards related to the assignments are addressed in class.

Every semester has a final exam (100 pts, 20% of the semester grade), and an End-of-Course exam is required by the state of TN at the EOY worth 15% of total grade to be determined by the state of TN. No field trips are currently planned. Parents will be notified in a timely manner if a field trip arises.

Required Materials

- Graphing Calculator (provided) – we'll use NumWorks in class, laptops to take home.
- Guided Notes (provided) – keep these organized, they're your cheat-code for tests.
- Loose-leaf graph notebook paper (avoid colored or wide ruled).
- Mechanical pencils (pens discouraged, no red pens – I use red for grading).
- Markers or highlighters for key points in notes.

Grading Policy/Evaluations

We use a points-based system. More assignments mean more points – simple math (with a minimum of two assignments per week). Every nine weeks has its own total, and your semester grade is calculated by the district:

- Semester 1: 40% first nine weeks, 40% second nine weeks, 20% final exam.
- Semester 2: 45% 3rd Nine weeks, 45% 4th Nine weeks, 10% EOC, no final exam.

Grades are updated weekly on PowerSchool, with at least two new entries per week. District weights are

only applied after the term ends for report card calculation purposes. Progress reports will be issued by the school as planned. Grades are based on format, neatness, completion, and correctness. At least two grades will be posted weekly. Assignments listed below are adjusted according to time and the year's challenges.

Class Work (CW) – 25 pts/week

Classwork is given daily to complete 25 pts per week. Grades are based on understanding, participation, and performance during class activities. If you miss a day or more, no CW grade is given to protect your current average, unless you recover the missing work by coming after school and completing it with me. If you show me that you have completed your missing CW guided notes properly, you will be excused. If you do not, you won't receive the CW points, but your average won't drop either.

Guided Notes – 10 or 20 pts

Guided Notes may be checked at random. To receive full credit, every question must be attempted. Blank answers will not count. Only the provided Guided Notes will be graded, not personal notebooks. I also observe your study habits, which will be considered when I am asked for letters of recommendation.

Homework (HW) – 15 or 25 pts

Homework is assigned weekly on DeltaMath and is usually due on Wednesday at 11:30 PM. Late homework is accepted through Sunday night with a 5% deduction per day. If I have not finished teaching all required topics by the previous Friday, I will extend the full-credit deadline. Students should not wait until the last day to begin homework.

This DM opens Sunday, Aug 23, and covers topics from Aug 24 - 28. It is due Wednesday, Sep 2, for full credit. After Wednesday, late submissions lose 5% per day until Sunday night, when they become overdue.

Bell Ringers (BR) – 15 pts/week

None planned at this moment. If assigned, every problem must show complete work for full credit. Bell ringers are quick daily warm-ups that prepare you for the lesson.

Common Assessment (CA) – 100 pts/unit

A test will be given after each unit or chapter. You'll know the test day at least one week in advance. Common Assessments cover major concepts and count for 100 points each.

Quizzes (QZ) – 100 pts every other week

Quizzes check your understanding before the bigger tests. They include multiple-choice, true/false, multiple select, and short-answer questions. Some require full work and justification. Quizzes are worth 100 points and occur every other week, covering the exact same topics as classwork and homework. In fact, the questions are the same questions, but with different numbers and are given on Delta Math or paper.

Late Work & Extra Credit

*Late homework is accepted up to 4 days (5% penalty per day) for a maximum of 80% credit. After 4 days, the assignment is a zero unless special circumstances are discussed **ahead of time** with me or brought to my attention by a parent or administrator. I must emphasize this: **Ahead of time**, not after the assignment has become overdue. If you wait until the last day and on that day something happens, you must immediately inform me and you will be given **only** one extra day, since one day was all you had when the emergency happened. If you tell me ahead of time and your reason is sound, you will be given more days, depending on your circumstances. Plan ahead, don't gamble with zeros - they add up fast.*

Homework deadlines are dynamic. While the default due date is Wednesday, if I do not finish covering the required material by the prior Friday, the due date will be moved to the next Friday (instead of next Wednesday). For any submissions after the extended Friday deadline, a 10% daily penalty will apply, with no homework accepted after the following Sunday unless the HW is extended by an entire week, which happens very rarely.

Extra credit is not offered to individual students. Everyone has the same opportunities for bonus points given to the whole class.

Makeup Work Policy

Per CMCSS policy, you have one day per day of excused absence to make up missed work. Assignments due on the day you return must be turned in immediately. It's your responsibility to check the class folder, Delta Math, and PowerSchool for missed work and schedule any makeup tests. If you don't schedule the make-up or don't show up for it, a zero will stay in the gradebook.

Three percent of the term grade is added to each quarter grade and final exams for Honors courses (five points for AP).

Grades are rounded to the nearest whole number. Example: $92.4 = 92$ (A), $92.5 = 93$ (A).

Note: *If you earn an “A” for both the 3rd and 4th Nine Weeks, you will be exempt from the second semester exam, in which case each nine weeks’ grades will effectively constitute 50% of your semester average*

Math Team

- *Participation in Math Club weekly training is optional but highly encouraged. In **late March 2027**, all students will take an in-class qualifying test for the opportunity to join the Math Team that will represent our school at the annual TMTA (Tennessee Mathematics Teachers’ Association) Statewide High School Mathematics Contest, which will be held on April 7, 2027, at Austin Peay State University (APSU). This qualifying test does not impact their course grade and is designed to help all students to prepare for the EOC and Final Exam.*
- *Students who make the Math Team and compete in the TMTA contest are excused from the first quiz given after the competition (or during the week of the competition). Their quiz grade will be derived from their contest performance using a fair conversion that accounts for differences in difficulty. The conversion will be discussed with the Math Team before the competition.*
- *Students who place in the top six individually, score 100 points or higher, or compete on a team that places 1st through 3rd will be mentioned in any math teacher letter of recommendation they request.*

Kirkwood High School Artificial Intelligence (AI) Policy

- *At Kirkwood High, we want your learning to reflect your own thinking, effort, and growth. To make sure everyone has a fair chance to succeed, using AI tools, such as ChatGPT, Grammarly, or any other AI that helps write, research, solve, or analyze, is **not allowed** for schoolwork.*
- *In my class, however, you may use AI as a **tutor at home** to help you understand concepts, not to get the answers. Some ChatGPT Algebra 2 Tutors are designed to teach you step by step without giving away the final answer. Click on GPTs, then, in the search box enter Algebra 2 Tutor and scroll down until you find one. Example:*

Hi, I'm Anna, your personal tutor for Algebra 2.

- *You may also use **Khanmigo** from www.khanacademy.org, an AI assistant created to help students learn and support teachers with classroom tasks. This gives every student access to extra help, like having a personal tutor, while keeping the work fair for all.*

Here is what that means for you:

- **Homework and Assignments:** *All assignments should be your own original work. You cannot use AI tools to write essays, answer questions, help you research or generate any part of your homework.*
- **Class Discussions and Presentations:** *When you speak in class or give a presentation, your ideas should come from you, not from an AI tool. This includes preparing your notes and/or slides.*
- **Projects and Group Work:** *Whether you are working solo or in a group, don't use AI to plan, research, or create any part of the project. Everyone in a group is responsible for keeping things “AI-free.”*

- **Academic Integrity:** Turning in work made by AI, or using it to get ahead, is considered cheating. It is not fair to your classmates, and it does not help you grow as a learner. Use AI only to understand the concepts and techniques.

If an AI tool is ever approved for use on a given assignment, the teacher will communicate and model how to appropriately use the AI tool for the given task. If you are ever unsure about what counts as using AI, ask your teacher first. The faculty at Kirkwood High is here to help you learn how to ethically use these types of tools and resources.

Classroom Expectations

- *Respect your teachers and classmates. Everyone in the room deserves to be treated with dignity, patience, and courtesy.*
- *Be on time. You are on time if you enter the classroom before or during the bell. Repeated issues will be marked as tardy and reported to parents. If you come from another teacher, you will be excused **only** if you have a note from the teacher with your name, the time and date, the teacher's name and the reason for the delay. Use common sense!*
- *Be prepared. Students who come unprepared (no pencils, no notes) will lose points for that day's work.*
- *If absent, you must make up the work after school to get full credit for classwork points.*
- *Have a positive attitude, be responsible, do your best, and participate.*
- *Respect others and their property. Writing on desks, calculators, or walls is immature and illegal.*
- *Behave like the young adults you are. If repeated behavior issues occur, I will contact parents or guardians so we can address the problem together.*
- *Raise your hand to talk and listen quietly when others are talking.*

Classroom Procedures

- *Start class with materials ready, bags under desks, and begin the Bell Ringer, if one is up.*
- *Stay focused during instruction. Ask questions but wait to be called on.*
- *No food, gum, or makeup in class. Water bottles with caps are okay.*
- *Finish early? Review notes or homework, not other class assignments.*
- *Announcements mean silence until we resume class.*
- *Cheating or suspicious behavior on tests results in partial credit or finishing the test after school. No retakes will be given if cheating is confirmed. Parents must contact me, and the principal must authorize further action.*

Restroom Policy & Dismissal

Restroom passes are not allowed during the first 10 minutes or the last 10 minutes of class (the 10/10 rule) unless it's a true emergency and cleared with me first. Plan with time and use restrooms during class changes whenever possible to avoid missing instruction.

*At the end of class, **remain seated** and don't switch desks until I dismiss you so we can exit in an orderly manner. The bell signals the end of class, but I dismiss students, not the bell or the intercom.*

Disciplinary Consequences

Minor Offenses may include minor disruptions, repeated lack of preparation, talking out of turn, getting up without permission, using phones or other devices improperly, uncooperative or defiant behavior, etc.

- *1st offense – Counsel and document the warning.*
- *2nd offense – Another documented warning, possible seat change, and parents may be contacted.*
- *3rd offense – Parent contact and referral to the assistant principal.*

Major Offenses include leaving class or school without permission, profanity, disrespect, fighting, theft, destruction of school property, alcohol, drugs, tobacco, weapons, gambling, false fire alarms, etc. These result in an immediate referral, or the administration or SRO may be called.

Tardy Policy

You must be ready to work by the time the tardy bell rings. In accordance with CMCSS policy:

- *1st tardy – Counsel/warning.*
- *2nd tardy – Parent contact.*
- *3rd tardy – Discipline referral.*

If you are late 10 minutes or more without a valid reason, you will be marked absent and an immediate referral will be issued.

Weekly work posted in the class folder and on Delta Math is vital for your success. If you have internet issues or other obstacles, notify me before the 100% credit window closes.
