Senior Visits

Feel free to make an appointment with your counselor for your Senior Visit (students are being scheduled for their meetings as well). We will check your high school credits, discuss your post high school plans, college applications, financial aid and scholarships at this meeting.

College Applications/High School Transcripts

Most colleges encourage students to apply for admission online. You can start applying for college now! Transcripts will also be sent electronically. Transcript requests should be entered in Parchment, please use the following link to set up your account (if you have not done so yet) and request transcripts:

Selective Service Registration

All males are required to register with the Selective Service when they turn 18. More information and the registration can be found at www.sss.gov

Letters of Recommendation

You may need letters of recommendation for a college application (mainly private colleges) as well as for scholarship applications. Typically you will need a maximum of 3 letters of recommendation. It is a good idea to think of 2 school personnel (teachers, advisors, coaches, etc) and 1 outside person (employer or a leader of an organization you volunteer with).

The counseling office has a recommendation form you can pick up during your Senior Visit for you to complete that will help people personalize your letters of recommendation. You may turn the completed form into the counseling office and we will make copies as you need them.

Please be courteous when asking for letters of recommendation and give the writer at least 2 weeks (do not ask the day before you need it) to write the letter and remember to say "thank you."

Application Process

Common Application vs Golden Gopher

*Common App is useful if you plan to apply to other colleges that use the Common App (typically private college)

- *Golden Gopher application is more user friendly.
- *Admission checklist/information.

Share My App

Students who complete their U of MN application will be invited (around October 15th) to share their application with the other University of Minnesota system colleges without paying an additional fee.

This only works when students first apply to the U of MN Twin Cities.

Application Deadlines

- *November 1st (early action)- students will receive a response (Admit, Defer, Deny) by January 31st
- *December 1st (early action 2)- students will receive a response (Admit, Defer, Deny) by February 15th
- *January 1st (regular)- students will receive a response (Admin, Defer, Deny) by March 31st

Nursing Program

1st

*Students must submit 3 supplemental documents for the Nursing program (when Nursing is selected for an applicant's first choice on the application, the supplemental documents will be available).

*Students must submit their application by November

ACT/SAT

*An ACT or SAT score is not required for classes through fall of 2027 for admission to the U of MN.

Academic Record/Transcript

*Students will self report their grades, you do not need to request a transcript be sent to the U of MN-Twin Cities

College Knowledge Month

October is known as College Knowledge Month. Most 2 and 4 year state colleges and universities (the MNSCU system and a few in the U of M system) will waive their application fees during this month. Here is the list of colleges that waive their application fees.

The counselors plan to host sessions in the Mac Lab during Advisory on Thursdays in October to help students with applications. This information will be posted in Google Classroom.

College Entrance/Placement Tests

There can be confusion about which test to take for college. ACT and SAT are taken for admittance to 4-year college/universities. ACT is more widely accepted (especially in the midWest) but some schools prefer one versus the other. If questions, check with the schools you are looking into.

Minnesota Technical and Community colleges (2-year schools) will require the Accuplacer (unless you have taken the ACT and met cut scores). The Accuplacer is a placement test that will indicate what level math and English classes the student should first take. If a student does not meet the cut scores for that school's Accuplacer test, the college will require the student enroll in remedial courses for the areas not met on the Accuplacer.
