<u>Who?</u> Name the people (individuals/groups) involved in this event	/1
<u>What?</u> Identify what caused this event in history to occur	/1
<u>When?</u> Include date(s) to give historical context	/1
<u>Where?</u> Cite the location of this/these event(s)	/1
<u>Conclusion:</u> Identify 3 results/consequences; these can be positive and/or negative. For example, draw conclusions about how your topic affected individuals, communities, other nations, and the world as a whole. In other words, how did this event change history? How does it impact us still <u>today?</u>	/3
