

Updates from the Galva Elementary Staff

Nurse West: Please make sure to keep your phone number(s) updated in Power School. As illnesses continue to spread throughout the school, kids get sick during that they need to go home.

Health Tip: You get a call halfway through your day that your child is ill and needs to be picked up from school. How long should they stay home before returning to the classroom? Consider these guidelines on when to keep a child home:

- If your child is running a fever, they should be kept home from school. A
 good rule of thumb is that a child should not return to school until they
 are fever-free for at least 24 hours without medication.
- If your child seems too sluggish and lethargic to pay attention in school, odds are they probably aren't able to learn much in class and should be kept home.
- If your child is experiencing a loud cough, frequent trips to the restroom, or any other symptoms that may be disruptive to both your child's learning and their classmates, they should be kept home until symptoms subside.
- If your child is contagious with an illness such as pink eye, they should be kept home until a doctor approves returning to school.

Your child should see a physician at an urgent care facility if they have:

- A persistent cough
- Ear or sinus pain
- A fever, cold, or the flu

- Frequent or painful urination
- Mild to moderate asthma attacks
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
- A rash
- A sore throat
- A sprain or strain

<u>4D</u>: As the weather is getting colder, please be sure your child has appropriate clothing for our recess outside. As long as the temperature and wind chill is above 20, we go outside. We are currently working on long division. We have begun the "traditional" method. We will continue practicing next week.

Please have students at the school by 5:45 PM (a special performance for Grandparents will happen during the day at 1:30 PM at the high school, please spread the word). The fourth-graders have been working hard to prepare bell and singing performances. We are very proud of them and hope they can all make it to our performance Thursday night! If your child wants, they can participate in the dress-up Christmas days that were created for fun by our 4th-6th grade K-Kids; these are all optional. Please keep filling in your December reading calendars. Those can be turned in before or after winter break. Homework this week:

 Read 20 minutes or more and mark the December Reading Calendar each night

<u>5D & 5P</u>: We have been having a lot of fun with our 12 days of Christmas dress-up days, so far. If you have not sent fold top bags with your student for our Christmas craft, it is not too late to do so. We are reading a realistic fiction book titled, "Woods Runner" to learn more about life during the American Revolution in ELA and Social Studies. Books and questions will be sent home Monday, December 11. Students will have reading homework, and questions to answer on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. All packets are due Friday morning.

Continue reading for the December Reading Calendar. Our reward party for reading 60 minutes each week of December will take place in early January.

<u>6W</u>: Math may look a little different over the month of December as I am piloting some new math curriculums. Our math curriculum committee is adopting a new program next year and we are trying out some possible choices. So far I have some great student feedback about new programing and the students are excited to try out some new styles of learning!
