



Accessing Virtual Writing Lab

1. Open the Zoom link to the Virtual Writing Lab.
2. <https://snu.zoom.us/my/virtualwritinglab>
3. Virtual Writing Lab hours can be found in the Professional Studies newsletter, in emails sent out to PS learners, on the Student Toolkit, or by emailing pstitleIII@SNU.edu and requesting the available hours.
4. You will first enter a virtual Writing Lab waiting room. Time in the waiting room will depend on how many other learners have entered the session. The goal will be to provide learners with privacy and complete attention.
5. The facilitator will let you into the virtual Writing lab when they have finished working with the previous learner.
6. In some cases, learners might work together with the facilitator if that is agreed upon by each learner.

Virtual Writing Lab Expectations for PS Learners

To support the effectiveness of your virtual Writing Lab experience the following expectations have been developed for all learners.

- Know your goals, deadlines, assignment instructions, and expectations.
- Be ready to share your screen within Zoom.
- Ask questions and respond to questions.
- Be open to suggestions.
- Take Notes to help yourself when working on your own.
- Use the strategies you learn and apply them to future writing assignments.
- Understand that writing is a process and there are many steps to becoming a better writer.
- Review your notes after the Writing Lab session.
- Follow up at future Virtual Writing sessions if needed.
- Tutor.com and 1-on-1 virtual tutoring sessions are also available to all PS learners.
