Summary:

In the second quarter of our fiscal year, we continue to see a reduced number of new cases, but expect those numbers to increase in the coming months as we implement a new marketing plan, including the launch of a new website by the end of summer, 2024. Of the 174 cases that were opened this quarter, 80% were held online. That said, we are seeing a small, but steady increase in the number of mediations held in person.

Website Dashboard:

The DRC website dashboard continues to allow individual board members and committees to access previous documents with ease via their board issued password. All relevant documents, meeting minutes and other similar items can be found there. While we have considered discontinuing the dashboard due to a suspected lack of use, we have surveyed the board and learned that it is a useful tool for members. Given this, we will continue to make the dashboard available.

Initiative to Recruit More Mediators:

In November of 2023, DRC staff implemented an initiative to recruit new mediators. The staff is now requesting that the trainers for each 40-hour training recommend 2 participants that the DRC will invite to mediate for us. Our goal is to recruit 10 new mediators by September. Currently, we have recruited 8 new mediators.

DRC PROGRAM/SERVICES UPDATE:

Volunteer Appreciation Party:

The DRC staff hosted approximately 37 mediators, board members, staff, and guests at Moonshine Grill on Friday, May 3rd. We used this opportunity to spend time together, acknowledge our volunteers' commitment to the DRC and celebrate our accomplishments. The volunteers were each gifted a blanket as a thank you gift for their hard work.

At this party DRC staff member, David Huang, shared the following statistics from 2023:

Total volunteer hours: 1,415 hours

Value of volunteer Mediator Contribution is \$176,875

Estimated savings for Travis County by providing mediation services: \$1,857,600

Bill Forbes, in Massachusetts mediated 43 times for 194 hrs

Craig Bell, mediated 25 times for 95 hours

Bob O'Keefe mediated 27 times for 88.5 hours and

Margaret Borden mediated 19 times for 80 hours

In 2023, 2,333 people were served, including 831 that ultimately participated in mediation. Whether they settled or not, 97.1% were satisfied with the staff, mediators and mediation process.

10. 4/18/24: Erin Patterson met with Cameron Joyner to review the website plan and agreement.
