Grade 4 Elementary Mathematics

Purpose of the Document: This document provides an overview of mathematics focus for students in grade 4. The information provided below is designed to support students, parents, and the school community to understand the major content of the course and the standards used to design it. To support the needs of students, teachers may make adjustments as needed. Please contact your child's teacher for additional information.

Program Vision: We strive to provide equitable access to *ALL* students to develop a foundational understanding of whole numbers, operations, geometry, measurement, fractions, and decimals.

Program Mission: Our mission is to develop the student's ability to think and reason mathematically using the standards of mathematical practices and to develop mathematical proficiency for *ALL* students so they can apply mathematics to real-world situations. We do this by providing quality mathematical learning experiences that are aligned with rigorous standards.

Course Description: Grade 4 Mathematics begins the year exploring numbers to one million. During the start of the year, they will compare and round whole numbers and continue to use their knowledge of place value to perform multi-digit arithmetic. Students will use all four operations with whole numbers to solve problems and then transition to fractions where they will extend their understanding of equivalent fractions and comparing and ordering fractions through the use of area models and number lines. Fourth grade math will dive more deeply into adding and subtracting fractions as well as extending the concept of multiplying fractions. Students will end the year interpreting data, comparing decimals, and working with lines, angles and shapes.
