Objective

To establish a collaborative arrangement between the Rotary Club of Edmonton Mayfield and the Rotary Club of Edmonton Sunrise to expand fundraising efforts, pool resources, and maximize impact for shared community and international service projects.

1. Goals and Objectives

- **Primary Goal:** Generate sustainable funds to support ongoing and new service projects.
- **Secondary Goals:**
 - Strengthen relationships between the two clubs.
 - Raise awareness of Rotary's community impact in Edmonton.
 - Provide networking and fellowship opportunities for Rotarians from both clubs.

2. Proposed Fundraising Initiatives with Risks/Disadvantages

Option A: Charity Dinner with Silent Auction (Fork It Over or Planes, Trains and Auctionables)

- **Description:** Host an evening event annually or bi-annually with dinner, entertainment, and a silent/live auction featuring items donated by local businesses, club members, and recipient organizations.
- **Benefits:**
 - Potential for high ticket revenue and donation matching.
 - Opportunity to engage members from both clubs and attract high-profile community members.
 - Opportunity to showcase projects and interact with recipients.
- **Budget:** Venue, catering, and event marketing.
- **Projected Revenue:** Ticket sales, auction proceeds, sponsorships, and direct donations.
- **Risks/Disadvantages:**
 - **High Costs and Financial Risk:** Venue rental, catering, and entertainment are costly, creating a high break-even point. If ticket sales are low, the event may incur a loss.
 - **Volunteer Fatigue:** Coordinating a large-scale event requires substantial volunteer effort, potentially leading to burnout if insufficient support is available from both clubs.
 - **Economic Sensitivity:** People may be less inclined to buy high-cost event passes during economic downturns, limiting potential revenue.
 - **Auction Item Acquisition:** Securing desirable items for the auction can be challenging and time-intensive, with potential reluctance from businesses to donate.
 - **Limited Audience Appeal:** Some community members may not find a high-cost dinner appealing, potentially reducing attendance and engagement.

Option B: Casual Mixer with Silent Auction (potentially hosted by Wolfe Automotive)

- **Description:** Host a relaxed, informal mixer event where attendees can socialize, enjoy light refreshments, and participate in a silent auction. The mixer setting creates a welcoming, low-pressure atmosphere that encourages casual conversation and networking. This event is perfect for attracting both seasoned Rotary supporters and newcomers interested in learning about Rotary's work in a laid-back environment.
- **Revenue Streams:**
 - Ticket sales for entry, including food and a drink.
 - Silent auction proceeds, featuring a range of items donated by local businesses and members.
 - Sponsorships from local businesses for event costs, auction items, or branded giveaways.
 - Additional revenue from drink sales, raffle tickets, or a 50/50 draw.
- **Suggested Silent Auction Items:**
 - Experience packages (e.g., dining vouchers, spa treatments, or weekend getaways).
 - Unique items like signed memorabilia, artwork, or themed gift baskets.
 - Local goods from small businesses or artisans.
- **Benefits:** A casual mixer is easy to organize and has a broad appeal, attracting a range of attendees who appreciate a relaxed setting. Silent auctions are a low-maintenance way to raise funds without interrupting the flow of the event. It also provides an opportunity for guests to learn more about Rotary's initiatives in an informal setting, which can inspire future support and engagement.

Option C: Joint Community Event (e.g., Charity Run/Walk or Family Festival)

- **Description:** Host a community-centered event such as a 5K charity run or family festival with proceeds going toward both clubs' primary service projects.
- **Benefits:**
 - Wide community appeal; attracts families, fitness enthusiasts, and community supporters.
 - Opportunity for sponsorships from local businesses.
- **Budget:** Shared expenses for permits, marketing, and venue rental, split between both clubs.
- **Projected Revenue:** Ticket sales, sponsorships, and donations.
- **Risks/Disadvantages:**
 - **Weather Dependency:** Outdoor events are highly susceptible to adverse weather conditions, which could deter participation and reduce revenue.
 - **High Upfront Costs:** Venue, permits, and marketing require a significant initial investment, which could lead to financial loss if the event underperforms.
 - **Volunteer Fatigue:** Coordinating a large-scale event requires substantial volunteer effort, potentially leading to burnout if insufficient support is available from both clubs.

- **Permit and Regulatory Challenges:** Securing permits and adhering to city regulations can be time-consuming and could lead to delays.

Option D: Online Raffle or 50/50 Draw

- **Description:** Conduct a virtual 50/50 draw or raffle, accessible to a broad audience in Edmonton and beyond.
- **Benefits:**
 - Lower overhead costs.
 - Allows for broader participation without geographical restrictions.
- **Budget:** Minimal costs for online raffle software and marketing.
- **Projected Revenue:** 50/50 draw proceeds or raffle ticket sales.
- **Risks/Disadvantages:**
 - **Legal and Regulatory Compliance:** Raffles require adherence to local gaming and lottery laws, which may limit or restrict options for participation and require additional administrative oversight.
 - **Limited Community Engagement:** A virtual raffle lacks the face-to-face interaction and community engagement present in physical events, potentially reducing the overall impact and brand visibility.
 - **Oversaturation of Online Raffles:** The online space is crowded with similar fundraising initiatives, which could reduce participant interest and decrease sales.
 - **Dependence on Digital Promotion:** Success heavily depends on effective online marketing, which may require additional expertise or resources for optimal reach.

3. Proposed Revenue Sharing Model

- Revenue and expenses for each event are proposed to be split equitably based on participation.

4. Timeline

- **Month 1:** Initial planning and committee formation with representatives from both clubs.
- **Month 2-3:** Finalize event details, secure permits, begin marketing efforts.
- **Month 4:** Execute the event; conduct post-event debriefing.

5. Marketing and Promotion Strategy

- **Joint Social Media Campaign:** Utilize both clubs' social media platforms for broader reach.
- **Press Release:** Announce the collaborative initiative to local media if appropriate.
- **Rotary District Involvement:** Share updates with District 5370 to garner additional support and participation from surrounding clubs.
- **Community Engagement:** Encourage members to invite family, friends, and colleagues to events and promote ticket sales.

6. Roles and Responsibilities

- **Event Chairpersons:** Each club designates a co-chair to oversee the event and coordinate with the other club.
- **Volunteer Teams:** Both clubs commit to providing volunteers for setup, event-day logistics, and takedown.
- **Finance and Sponsorship Committees:** Joint committee to manage the budget, sponsorships, and revenue tracking.

7. Expected Outcomes

- Enhanced fundraising capacity for both clubs.
- Increased visibility for Rotary's mission and work within the Edmonton community.
- Strengthened partnership and camaraderie between members of both clubs.

8. Next Steps

- Schedule a joint meeting between Rotary Club of Edmonton Mayfield and Rotary Club of Edmonton Sunrise to review the proposal and gather feedback.
- Form a planning committee to begin organizing the preferred fundraising event.

Addendum 1: Types of Auctions

The auctions suggested in Options A and B could include any of the following.

Addendum 3: Out-of-the-Box Fundraising Ideas

To capture attention and create a unique experience for attendees, here are some innovative fundraising ideas that go beyond traditional auctions and events. These options offer creative ways to engage the community, attract new supporters, and add excitement to the collaborative efforts of the Rotary Club of Edmonton Mayfield and the Rotary Club of Edmonton Sunrise.

1. “Reverse Auction”

19. Pet Photo Contest and Calendar Sale

- **Description:** Organize a photo contest where community members submit photos of their pets, paying a small fee per submission. The top entries are featured in a Rotary calendar, which is then sold as a fundraiser.
- **Revenue Streams:**
 - Entry fees for pet photo submissions.
 - Calendar sales featuring winning photos.
 - Sponsorships for each month in the calendar or pet-related businesses.
- **Benefits:** Appeals to pet owners and animal lovers and creates an engaging, family-friendly contest. The calendar can serve as a year-round fundraiser with long-lasting visibility for Rotary.
