# **School Safety Update**

The data from the Triton Smart Sensors continues to demonstrate their effectiveness as a deterrent for vaping on campus. With the latest software update, we have been able to activate an audible alert feature when vaping is detected. This enhancement has had a noticeable impact, leading to a substantially reduced number of incidents reported over the past month.

The Triton sensors have proven to be a valuable asset to the school, helping to create a safer and healthier environment for our students.

## **Technology Update**

- Chromebooks for the 2025-2026 school year have been ordered and will arrive in early June for processing.
- The baseball AWRE camera system has been successfully installed and is being implemented in practices and games.
- Preparations for summer technology cleanup and device upgrades are in full swing.
- JI will complete a cabling upgrade (to the main building) this summer to accommodate modern PA and camera equipment.
