We marked the start of another very full term with a 'mihi whakatau' to welcome new staff and ākonga first thing on Monday morning.

Each Learning Community has shared a bit about what they will be focusing on later in this newsletter.

It's important to note that some of the 'Weeks' we acknowledge and celebrate will occur this term. These are always in our newsletter calendars and in the <u>online</u> <u>calendar</u>, which whānau can link to their own digital calendar. More information in this newsletter.

One of the questions we are asked a lot by new whānau to the school is whether we have a 'School Donation'. Our Board of Trustees has chosen for a number of years to be part of the Ministry of Education Donations Scheme.

This means we get some funding per student from the MOE, which helps with budgeting. It also means that we can not ask for any money from whānau for trips, visits etc. The exception being overnight camps.

This is why fundraising is so important for our school (and others). We really appreciate and rely on whānau supporting fundraising events we hold over the year. For whānau, it may be getting involved with events, for others it will be helping with fundraisers.

Each year we aim to get fundraising funds for our school in the following ways...

FOTs - Friends of the school fundraisers - There are many, for example Hot Cross Buns, Mini Fairs, Calendar Art - these pay for each learning community to be involved in a trip or experience which supports learning focuses.

Grant Applications - Shane (one of our OPS whānau) completes grant applications based on supporting school events and school equipment - *this year she has already been successful in some grant applications - more in this newsletter.*

Our two Big Fundraisers each year - Fun Run and Beats By Bingo - These are annual events. We rely on funds raised by these events when we are planning the year and the year's budget. In 2025, these events will pay for teacher professional learning in Literacy (we see our staff as the most powerful resource we have to support learning our ākonga) and Maths equipment kits for each whānau class and learning community.



Term 2 Learning in our Learning Communities

Kiwi Learning Community - Year 0-1 Kōhanga Kiwi, Aniwaniwa, Ua, Hukarere

A warm welcome to all our new whānau, and a big welcome back to those returning. The Kiwi Learning Community is looking forward to an exciting and enriching term ahead, especially as we begin our collaboration in spelling.



Our inquiry focus for the term is: "How do things grow, change, and stay alive?"

Through this inquiry, students will deepen their understanding of living things and the conditions they need to survive and thrive. They will engage in hands-on exploration of the life cycles of plants and insects, gaining meaningful experiences in our natural world.

We will also be exploring stories and legends related to the living world, enriching our understanding through both scientific and cultural lenses.

This inquiry connects naturally with various areas of learning:

- Mathematics focusing on ordinal numbers, patterns and time
- **Literacy** through descriptive writing, reading about life cycles, and expanding scientific vocabulary

• **The Arts** – with opportunities to draw and sketch the different stages in the life cycles of living things

Our Learning Community will continue to use the **iDeaL Learning Approach** for spelling and reading. This term, Year 1 students will be collaborating across classrooms for spelling instruction, offering valuable opportunities to build connections with all the teachers in the Kiwi Learning Community.

In sport with Jim K, our focus will be on building game skills, teamwork, and inclusion through fun and engaging activities.

We're looking forward to a fantastic term of learning, growth, and connection!

Kea Learning Community - Year 2 Puia, Te Ao and Ahi

Kia ora Kea Whānau.

Welcome to Term 2! This term, our inquiry topic is 'Mauri Tū, Mauri Ora' – Standing together in life and wellness. Our focus will be on learning how to keep ourselves safe and healthy.



We will explore this theme through the integration of health, science, the arts and social sciences, with particular emphasis on the *Whare Tapa Whā* model of holistic wellbeing, focusing on *Taha Tinana* – physical health. The inquiry will cover key areas such as the importance of sleep, hydration, nutrition, hygiene, and safety during emergencies. To enhance our learning, we will be welcoming expert guests into the school to share their knowledge and help us deepen our understanding of these important aspects of physical health.

In maths, we will continue to build our number knowledge through our *Number of the Day* activity. At the beginning of the term, we will focus on measurement, exploring length and mass.

We will also continue to build on ākonga' knowledge of the iDeal scope and sequence for spelling and reading. Many of the texts we read in class will tie into our "Bounce Back" topics for the week, reinforcing and expanding on our learning from Term 1.

We are also excited to welcome Sarah Vlietman as part of our team. She will be the Whānau teacher for Kea Puia, and we are thrilled to have her on board!

We look forward to a great term of learning and growth!

Kereru Team -Nikau, Kahikatea, Tawa, Miro and Puriri

Kia Ora whānau, welcome to Term 2. Hopefully you have had a wonderful Easter break and students will be coming back to school refreshed and ready for another full term of learning.

In Weeks 1 and 2, we will be focusing on **ANZAC Day** and learning some facts about its history and importance to New Zealand.

From Week 3, they will be learning all about **Fossils** with an emphasis on the prehistoric plants and animals of New Zealand. Students will understand the processes that create fossils and will be able to describe how animals, plants and trees have evolved differently in our country.

In Week 4 (22nd and 23rd May), the **Fossil van** will be visiting us from Auckland Museum. This will provide students with hands-on experiences to enhance their learning. There will be many mini projects the students can complete as part of their home learning. Students across the school will be celebrating Science and Technology in Week 4. We have Bully Free Week and Pink Shirt Day in Week 3, Samoan Language Week in Week 6 and Matariki towards the end of the term.

As with Term 1, our writing and reading will be integrated with our Inquiry focus. There will be a focus on writing to inform, which reflects the nature of their inquiry learning. The teachers will continue teaching reading and writing collaboratively this term, and the students across the team will be taught according to their needs.

For maths, the students will focus on multiplication and division, building knowledge and using facts they know to solve problems. There will also be a big focus on measurement of time, looking at analogue clocks, and measuring time on a timeline. This will also be integrated with our inquiry learning.

Students will also learn to share some learning using the app Pic Collage on an iPad. They will learn the skills of inserting pictures and using captions. For PE, they will learn some games that involve movement and strategy.

Please continue communicating with your child's teacher on Hero or via email if you have any concerns or queries. An exciting term ahead with a lot of fun and learning.

Kia ora Pīwakawaka Year 5 whānau,

Welcome to Term 2! We are excited to be diving into a term full of exciting learning across the curriculum.

Our inquiry this term is called "Changing States in a Changing World". We'll be exploring the different states of matter—solids, liquids, and gases—and how they change. This science-based inquiry will also link closely to volcanoes, giving our tamariki a chance to investigate the powerful changes that happen within our Earth.



In literacy, we will be focusing on descriptive writing, poetry, procedural texts, and explanations, with many opportunities to connect with our inquiry learning. Our reading programme will be integrated into inquiry too, allowing students to explore factual texts and develop their comprehension through meaningful contexts. iDeal spelling will continue to be a strong focus as we build our students' confidence and accuracy with words.

In mathematics, our focus areas will be volume, temperature, and statistics, which will be integrated with number knowledge and our inquiry theme. We'll be measuring, estimating, and interpreting data as we explore the science of change.

The arts this term will be on drama and visual art to express the movement and energy of volcanoes and the different states of matter. Students will get creative and expressive as they bring their learning to life through performance and art-making.

In PE, our focus will be on invasion games, using modified activities to build teamwork, strategy, and movement skills in a fun and engaging way.

It's shaping up to be a vibrant and exciting term.

Piwakawaka Learning community -Year 6 - Waitā, Waipuna-a-rangi, Tipuānuku

Tenā koutou katoa. Greetings to all our whānau.

This term, our Year 6 ākonga will embark on two exciting learning journeys

Weeks 1-5: Science "Kia Tūhura: Let's Investigate!"

We are diving into the Nature of Science, exploring how science helps us understand the world. Ākonga will develop skills in asking scientific questions, carrying out investigations, and communicating their findings. We will explore states of matter, chemical reactions, and the forces around us through hands-on experiments, promoting critical thinking, collaboration, and curiosity.

Weeks 6-9: The Arts "Our Stories, Our Voice"

In the second half of the term, ākonga will move into The Arts, using drama and film to tell personal or cultural stories. They will take on roles such as directors, actors, and editors, developing scripts, filming short movies, and celebrating their creativity. Through this project, our ākonga will build confidence in expressing themselves and working collaboratively to share their unique voices with others.

We are looking forward to a fun and engaging term of discovery, creativity, and growth!

It would be awesome to have whanau come along and share too!






We will also be offering the opportunity to share something with our ākonga. You are welcome to come and support your child if they are doing this.
