Course Description:

College Preparatory Course (P). This course meets the University of California's **d** (laboratory science) subject area requirement. This is an *intensive* elective course designed primarily for 12th grade students who wish to gain an in-depth understanding of the Physiology and Anatomy of the human body via lab, lecture, case studies, independent study, presentations, mammalian dissection, and possible medical internships. The goal is to prepare *highly motivated* students for the rigors of nursing or medical school. Guest speakers, Physio movie nights, and various field trips may be scheduled to enhance this medically minded course. Minimal work over the summer will be recommended before starting the class [book reading & CD-ROM work]. This is a demanding course and the time commitment *varies greatly*, but in general students must be prepared to spend an average of one to two additional hours outside of class time per hour of class time, to successfully complete the course.

In order to receive the Honors distinction, the student must receive a passing grade on the District's Honors Physiology exam in June.
