Persian and Iranian Studies Program (PISP):

PISP is dedicated to promoting teaching, scholarship, and thoughtful public discourse about all aspects of the history and culture of the Persianate world. Students have the opportunity to study up to four years of Persian language and literature taught in the target language, as well as courses on Persian literature, history, culture in English translation.

PISP offers both undergraduate and graduate degrees in MELC with a focus on Persian and Iranian studies and works closely with a wide range of other programs and departments on campus, including the Interdisciplinary Ph.D. program in Near and Middle Eastern Studies.
