FACULTY & STAFF

LLHS has 76.2 teachers, 3.6 administrators, 4.8 counselors, 1 psychologist, 1 librarian, 1 wellness coordinator, and 1 college & career advisor. Counselor caseloads average 325:1. Over the past several years, LLHS has experienced high turnover of teachers, counselors, and administrators.

SCHEDULE

The school year consists of two approx. 18-week semesters. LLHS operates on a modified block schedule, offering seven class periods plus a "0 period" for students taking Jazz Ensemble Honors. In general, approx 6% of seniors take seven periods, 55 % take six, and 40% take five or fewer.

EXTRACURRICULARS & SPORTS

LLHS offers a variety of extracurricular programs, including student government, Link Crew, vocational training/ROP, California Scholarship Federation (CSF), peer tutoring, speech & debate, Model United Nations, Mock Trial, VAPA programs, and 90+ clubs. LLHS is a member of the Diablo Athletic League, under the guidance of the North Coast Section (NCS) of the California Interscholastic Federation. Las Lomas supports 25 Varsity and 30+ JV/Freshmen teams.

AP & HONORS CLASSES

Most AP/Honors classes are taken by Juniors and Seniors. 9th-grade students are ineligible. Seniors can take either AP Government or AP Macroeconomics, but not both. We do not offer dual enrollment. The average number of AP/Honors classes taken by the class of 2025 is 6.

GRADING

LLHS calculates GPA on a weighted and unweighted 4.0 scale. A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0. AP/Honor courses carry an additional point. A D is a passing grade. LLHS does not report individual class rank.

Final transcripts reflect weighted and unweighted GPAs. The cumulative GPA is the average of all courses. College prep courses that meet the University of California A-G requirements are indicated with a "P" (college prep), "H" (honors), or "A" (AP). Non-college prep courses are marked with an "E" (elective), "N" (non-college prep), or "M" (modified curriculum). Pluses and minuses appear on transcripts but are not used in computing GPAs.
