

Grades - Weighted by 3 categories

1) Completion Only Homework/Participation

- ★ 10% of your grade
- ★ Paper assignments/review activities.
- ★ Every assignment is worth 10 points.
- ★ To get full credit, attempt every problem and show work labeled neatly in your binder
- ★ This category is a completion grade only, not based on accuracy
- ★ Late assignments will only get a maximum of 6 points as answer keys and solutions will be posted after the due date.
- ★ Homework is for practice so make corrections as needed and write in correct answers as well as helpful tips

2) Graded assignments

- ★ 20% of your final grade. This includes IXL and Big Ideas assignments as well as any other work with an accuracy grade. (google forms, collected worksheets, desmos, etc)
- ★ Each is worth 10 points and will be based on accuracy.
- ★ On graded assignments, points will be awarded based on the percent correct. For example, a 78% accuracy will get a 7.8/10, a 95% accuracy will get 9.5/10
- ★ To get full credit for IXL assignments, you need a smart score of 80 or higher. Each IXL will be worth 10 points. A smart score of 80 means you get the full 10 points. Smart scores above 80 will get more than 10 points and smart scores below 80 will get less than the full 10 points

3) Assessments

- ★ Assessments are worth 70% of your final grade. There are two types of assessments: quick checks and tests

Quick checks

- ★ Worth 25 points
- ★ Short checks over one or two topics
- ★ Generally unannounced. No review or study guides
- ★ You can use all notes and homework assignments for help
- ★ If you score poorly (D or F) on a quick check, see me for help on the concepts and to raise your grade by retaking the quick check to raise the score to a C-

Tests

- ★ Tests are worth 100 points.
- ★ Cover a larger unit of study
- ★ Tests will be announced a few days in advance and you GENERALLY will be given a study guide or other review materials.
- ★ If you score poorly (grade of D or F) on a test, see me to make a plan to increase your understanding and raise your grade to a C.
