1 Read a Book: Read about money in this book. You can read it yourself or click on the icon to have it read to you. After you have read the book, draw a picture of one thing you would like to save your money to buy. Be sure to label your picture.	2 Draw a Picture: What is a good and a service? Complete this matching activity about goods and services. Then, use this handout and draw one picture of a good and one picture of a service. Then write about each picture you drew.	3 Nearpod: Let's learn about producers and consumers in this Nearpod. You will read and watch a video about the value of money in our society. Use this code to join: U5LVX
4 Watch the Video: Watch this video about money. Choose one of the questions the kids were asked, and answer it for yourself. Draw a picture of your answer and label your picture.	5 Justify your Decision: Look at this picture. In a sentence, identify what are the two items you need to choose from for your lunch today. Explain which item you will choose and why it is the best choice. Then explain what you are giving up when you make that decision (what are the benefits you will not get by choosing the other item?).	6 Inquiry Project: What do you want to save your money for? Think about things you need or want. Make a list of these things. Choose the top three things you really want to buy with your money. Brainstorm ways you could make and save money to buy those items.
7 Watch the Video: Watch Schoolhouse Rock's video, "Three Ring Government." Here are the lyrics to the video so you can follow along. After you watch the video, draw a picture or write a short paragraph about the three parts of government. What are the three parts of government, and what do they each do?	8 Be a Good Citizen: Think about how you can be a good helper at your school. Is there a problem that needs to be solved? What can you do to solve it? For example, is there trash that needs to be picked up? Or is there a student who needs a friend to talk to? Find a problem that you could help fix by being a good citizen. Share with a family member the problem and your solution.	9 Inquiry Project: What are the three branches of government? Look at this infographic. What do you wonder about this? Create a list of questions you have about this infographic. Talk with a friend and see how you can figure out the answers to some of your questions.
