

Stay home whenever you can, except to get medical care!



Stay at least six feet from other people, even if they don't look ill. Find out what your community's policies are regarding leaving your home.

Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.



Do so before you eat or prepare food, and after you sneeze, cough, blow your nose, or visit any public place. If you cannot wash with soap and water, use hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol.



- Families First Coronavirus Response Act was passed on March 18th mandating that Medicare, Medicaid, other government plans, and most private plans cover COVID-19 testing — and all testing-related services — entirely, which means no co-pays, no deductibles, no co-insurance charges.
 - HOWEVER, if your visit does not result in a COVID-19 test, if you get tested somewhere not in your insurance plan's network, or if you're treated in any way besides getting a test, you could end up with a bill.
 - If experiencing any symptoms at home, please CALL your primary care provider or a local health center to learn whether you should get tested for COVID-19, before going to a doctor's office. More coverage on what is or not covered by the law available here.





Reduced Hours / Unemployment benefits

- If an employer establishes a <u>Short Time Compensation Plan</u>, and an employee meets the qualifications to file a re-employment assistance claim in the state of Florida, the employee will receive a partial re-employment check to supplement their reduced paycheck
- Emergency Paid Sick Leave Act stipulates that all employees of employers with fewer than 500 employees, regardless of the length of their tenure with their employer, are eligible for paid sick leave under the Emergency Paid Sick Leave Act.
 - You qualify if:
 - You are quarantined due to COVID-19 (whether diagnosed or seeking a diagnosis due to symptoms)
 - You are caring for an individual who is in isolation due to COVID-19
 - You are staying home to take care of your child
 - Full-time employees receive 80 hours of paid sick leave. Part-time employees receive the
 equivalent of the number of hours they would work, on average, during a two-week
 period.
 - The law will come into effect on April 2
- Emergency Family and Medical Leave Expansion Act (FMLA Expansion Act) (Link)
 - provides eligible employees whose child's school or place of care has closed due to the COVID-19 public health emergency with a new federal source of paid leave

- The initial 10 days of leave are unpaid, but the employee may elect to use his/her accrued paid sick leave and/or accrued vacation during this otherwise unpaid period. After the initial 10-day period, an employee is entitled to receive from the employer two-thirds of his/her normal wages for the number of hours he/she would be regularly scheduled to work, up to a maximum of \$200 per day and \$10,000 in total.

 - Those who are laid off or sent home without pay for an extended period by their employer due to COVID-19 concerns; and

 - Individuals whose employment has been impacted, but are still receiving wages through paid leave are not eligible to receive Reemployment Assistance.



- Walmart: plan to hire 150,000 U.S. hourly workers for its stores and distribution centers through
 the end of May as online orders surge with households stocking up. The jobs are temporary, but
 many will become permanent.
- <u>Domino's</u>: hiring about 10,000 workers in the U.S. to meet rising demand for delivery and carryout call for delivery drivers, pizza makers, managers and truck drivers. Domino's U.S. stores remain open for carryout and it is also offering contactless delivery.
- Amazon: hiring 100,000 people across the U.S. to fulfill orders.
- <u>Costco</u>: On Twitter, images of notes from Costco management have started circulating asking for recommendations for job candidates to help manage spikes in sales and foot traffic. On its website, Costco says it is currently hiring for a wide variety of jobs across the US.
- Aldi: currently hiring in "all stores and warehouses," according to its website.
- CVS: CVS plans to immediately fill 50,000 full-time, part-time and temporary roles in locations around the US. It will use virtual job fairs and interviews to hire store associates, home delivery drivers, distribution center employees and customer service representatives.
- 7-Eleven hire approximately 20,000 people "to meet increased demand."



Mortgage and Evictions

- 04/02/20 Governor Ron DeSantis issued an Executive Order preventing evictions or mortgage foreclosures due to non-payment of rent due to the COVID-19 emergency until May 17.
 - Link to the Executive Order.
 - o In a press conference on May 13, 2020 in Tallahassee, when asked about the expiration of this order, DeSantis stated, "I think we're going to do it through the end of the month. We'll have an announcement on that I think very soon."
- Mortgage assistance:
 - Ally Bank is allowing existing customers to defer mortgage payments for up to 120 days.
 No late fees will be charged, but interest will accrue.
 - Bank of America mortgage customers who find themselves struggling financially due to coronavirus <u>can defer their payments</u>; this applies to both mortgages and home equity loans. To defer payments, mortgage holders need to request deferment directly through the bank and the waived payments will be added to the end of their loan term.
 - As of now, there are no guidelines in place on how many payments can be waived or for how long. The deferments will be approved on a case-by-case basis.
 - Citibank: some mortgage customers may be eligible for a hardship program through Cenlar FSB, the bank's service provider. For assistance, call Cenlar FSB at 855-839-6253 (Mon–Fri, 8:30 a.m.–8 p.m. ET or Sat, 8:30 a.m.–5 p.m. ET).
 - Quicken Loans is offering temporary forbearance to borrowers who might be unable to
 make mortgage payments due to financial hardship from the coronavirus pandemic.
 Borrowers who have conventional loans won't have their credit score impacted during
 the forbearance; a filled out form is needed to apply.

- I'm worried about seeking medical care and getting deported/arrested because I'm undocumented:
 - ICE announced on 3/18/2020 that they will halt enforcement in the US except against those with a criminal history saying, they will "delay enforcement action" and use "alternatives to detention"
 - "During the COVID-19 crisis, ICE will not carry out enforcement operations at or near health care facilities"
- I'm worried about getting tested for coronavirus because it might hurt my immigration case or because of the "public charge" rule?
 - US Citizenship and Immigration Services announced on March 14, 2020 that "USCIS will neither consider testing, treatment, nor preventative care (including vaccines, if a vaccine becomes available) related to COVID-19 as part of a public charge inadmissibility determination"
