What is this course about?

Drama students will further develop drama techniques, elements, and conventions within a course covering theatre in a historic and contemporary context, ensemble devising, and advanced scripted work.

Students will refine their ability to explore and reflect on drama processes through viewing live professional theatre performances and directed portfolio work.

What sorts of things will I do?

Students will explore the Elizabethan Theatre Form (Shakespeare) and perform a scene focusing on drama techniques.

There will also be a focus on drama creation (Devising) through working with a stimulus.

There is an expectation at this level that students will be willing to work as a team and make positive contributions to class discussion, devising, plus there is plenty of opportunity for performance, culminating in the presentation of a drama performance for an outside audience.

Learning capabilities/ critical skills

- **Performance Skills**: Developing more advanced acting techniques, including voice, movement, and character development.
- **Collaboration and Teamwork**: Enhancing the ability to work collaboratively in groups to create and perform drama, fostering communication and cooperation.
- **Text Analysis**: Understanding and interpreting dramatic texts, focusing on themes, characters, and narrative structure.
- **Devising and Creativity**: Creating original drama pieces, encouraging imaginative thinking and the ability to bring creative ideas to life.
- **Reflective Evaluation**: Learning to critically evaluate personal and group performances, identifying strengths and areas for improvement to guide future work.
- **Exposure to Professional Work**: Experiencing live theatre to understand professional standards and draw inspiration from professional performances.

Do I have to perform/act in front of an audience?

Yes, this is a performance-based course with the expectation to perform in all internal standards and classroom activities/exercises.

Do I have to have done Level One Drama previously to do Level 2 Drama?

Are there any rehearsals or performances outside of school time?

Yes, students will be expected at certain periods of time to be rehearsing in out-of-school hours and the production standard AS 91218 will be assessed in a public performance evening.

Are there costs involved in this course?

Yes, class trips to the theatre will incur ticket and transport costs.

Any theatre trips will be the source material for focusing on the external exam AS 91219.
