Code of Conduct

The Green Bean Project is founded on the principles of **respect** and **kindness**. Aggressive and disrespectful behaviors, whether from children, parents, or staff, will not be tolerated. Any participants or family members who are behaving in an aggressive or unsafe manner may be terminated from the Green Bean Project at the program director's discretion.

Green Bean Rule #1: RESPECT. Respect the stage, respect yourself, respect others.

Green Bean Rule #2: KINDNESS. We are kind to ourselves, others, and our world.

Kindness exists even in disagreements.

Expectations for Green Bean Parents and Participants

- Please read all communication from the Green Bean Project, especially as we get close to Stories to Stage rehearsals and performances.
- Green Bean students are photographed at some classes, events, and performances. If you do not want a photograph/media of your child shared, please let us know.
- All roles are vital to performances, regardless of the number of lines a child has. Children are expected to attend all classes and rehearsals leading up to the performance. Additional rehearsals are often added in the final weeks before performance night. In the event of an extenuating circumstance in which your child will not be able to attend rehearsal please notify Joscelyn as soon as possible. Failure to attend multiple practices/rehearsals may

result in a reduction of a child's role. Performers must be available to attend BOTH the Friday night and Saturday performances of Stories to Stage in March.

- Just like academics, sports, or any other activities it is strongly encouraged that the performers practice their lines outside of their scheduled class time. If you find that your child is struggling to remember their lines, or has questions about their role, please reach out to Joscelyn for assistance.
- Your child's role may be adjusted as shows develop. The Green Bean Project strives to give every child an opportunity to participate in a way that works best for them. This may mean decreasing or adding lines over time. Changing roles or lines as the show develops should not be perceived as punitive but rather a necessary move to enhance the show overall. The Director makes changes only after serious consideration for the good of the show.

Class Tuition & Program Fees

Following online reservation, you will receive an online invoice for tuition if you enrolled in a recurring class/program. The majority of families select the automatic monthly payment as the tuition schedule of preference. Once you pay the online invoice it will recur monthly until the end of the program.

If your child adds a class or program your invoice will be adjusted and you must manually pay online one-time to have the automatic withdrawal start. Green Bean can not view your full payment information nor change your invoicing (*with the exception of canceling*) without your consent in the form of paying the first invoice manually.

- Late Fees: If your payment is more than 10 days late you may incur a late fee of \$10
- If your tuition payment is more than 30 days we will assume you are withdrawing your child from the program unless we receive a response to our communication attempts. This means we will open the spot to a child on the waitlist.
