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## Writing Your News Article

#### 1. Lead sentence

This section is the Hook! It should grab your reader's attention immediately.

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#### 2. Introduction ( Use [this article from BiteSize English](#) for more information on using facts in an article.)

This is where you record the facts you have found out. Include Who, What, When, Where

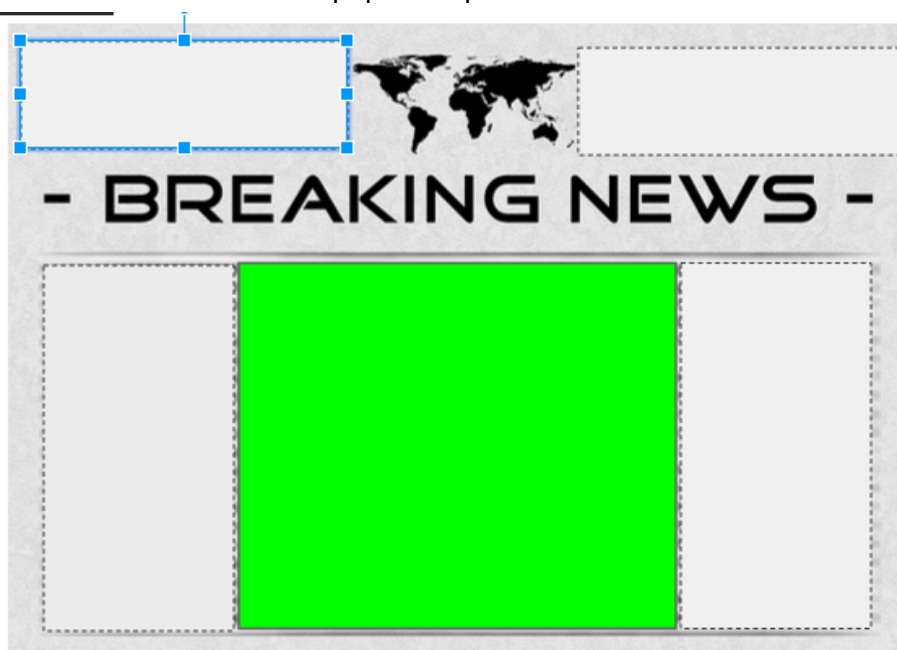

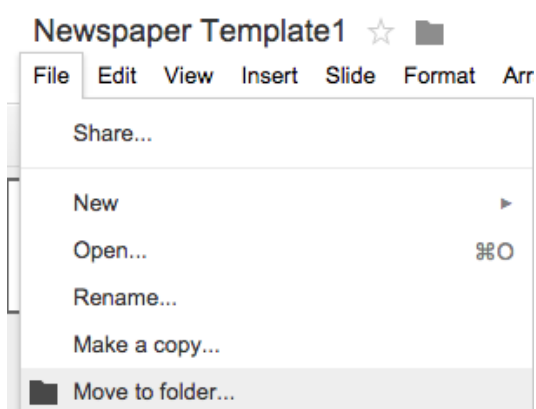
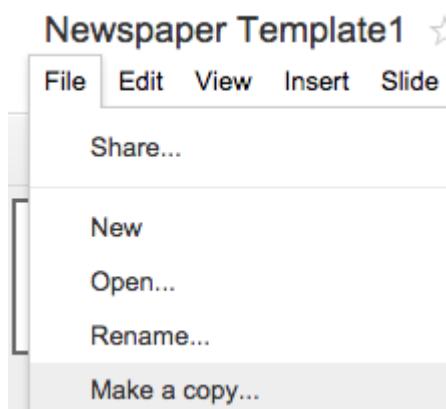

## Working With the Templates

You can choose one newspaper template from the four that have been prepared for you.



Make a **copy of template** and move it to your ICT Folder in Google Drive.

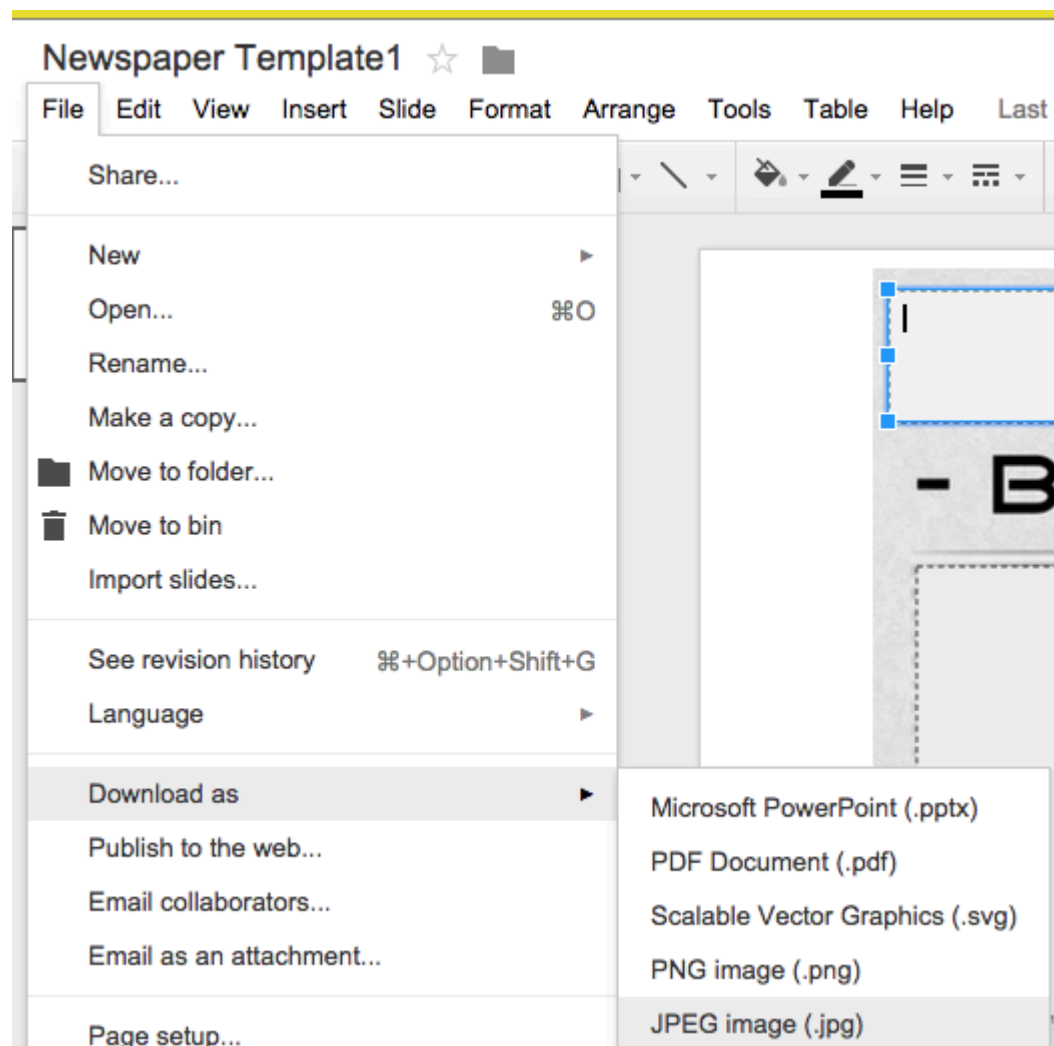


**Do not move or write in the green box.** That space is reserved for the video. Instead use the text boxes included in the template to structure your article.



You can copy and paste your writing right into them. You may want to modify the font size and style when you do so.

Once you have finished you can **download** your article as an **jpeg image**.



**Upload** a copy of it to your ICT File in **Google Drive**. That way you will be sure to have access to it when you need it. You will also need to email it to the iPad you have been assigned. These are abcict email addresses eg abcict1 etc...

**Next, you will need a script for the newscast.**

You are familiar with Tellagami as we used it in the Creative Carousel.

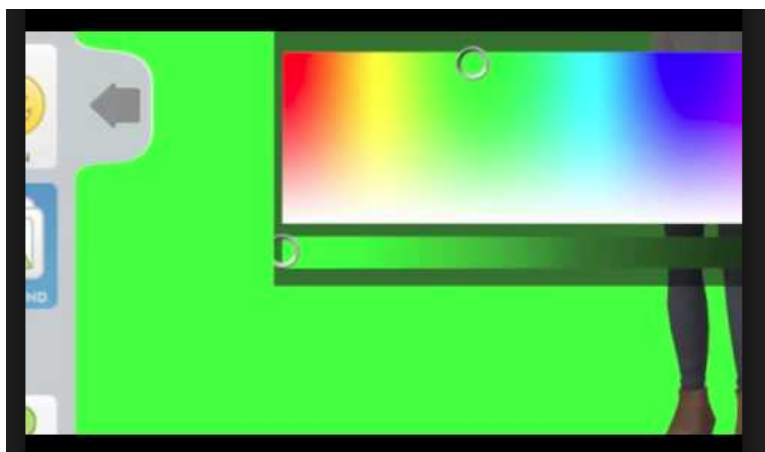

## Tellagami

As mentioned earlier, you are familiar with Tellagami as we used it in the Creative Carousel. In this lesson you will create a newscaster, who will report on the eruption, using this application.



You can modify your avatar's gender and looks as well as add a background to your newscast. Here is a [short tutorial](#) in case you need a reminder of how to do this.

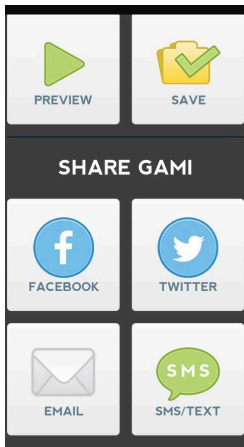
For this project you will need to use a green background which is the same hue as the one in the newspaper article you wrote. Try to get the colour as similar as possible.



Use the Doodle Option to Select the Green Background.



Use the Share Option to download your Tellagami as well as email it to your iPad.



## Next....Record your newscast!

**Download** your Tellagami newscast to your device and email a copy of it to yourself. You will also need to email it to the iPad you have been assigned. These are abcict email addresses eg abcict1 etc...

## iPad Lessons

### Downloading your media!

#### Image

First you will need to gather your media onto the iPad.

Firstly, download the newspaper report image you sent to the iPad, from the **Mail App**. You should also have a copy in your **Google Drive ICT Folder** and it can also be downloaded from that location if needed.

Make sure you add the picture to the **Camera Roll**.








You emailed this video to the iPad you are working on. Download it from the **Mail App**.



#### Volcano Video

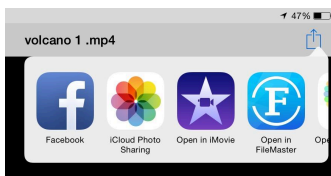
You will have to download this video from Google Drive on the iPad. You cannot do this using the **Drive App** so we will use an alternative app for it. First you need search out and log into the [GDrive App](#).

**Follow the Steps Below**

<p>Log In by clicking the <b>+</b>.</p> 	<p>Select Google Drive.</p> 	<p>Log in to your school account and select your file.</p>  <p>Download the file.(bottom left)</p> 
<p>Don't forget to Log out! Click the <b>Edit</b> option.</p> 	<p>Select your account.</p> 	<p>Log out of your account.</p> 

## iMovie

When you download the Volcano video you will open it using iMovie. This is one of the options you will be given,

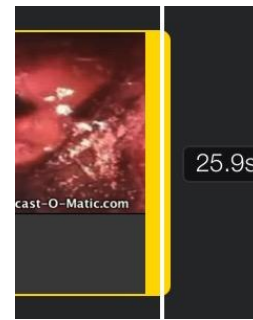
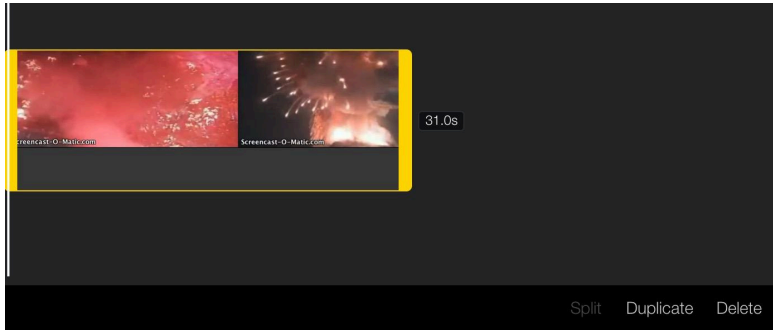


**Consider the Length of the Video:** How long is your script?

The videos are around 30 seconds long. Will you need to duplicate it and cut it back to the time you need for your script?

Use the **Duplicate** option at the bottom right.

Then cut the video back if needed by dragging the yellow **handle** to the left. Export your video to the **Camera Roll**.



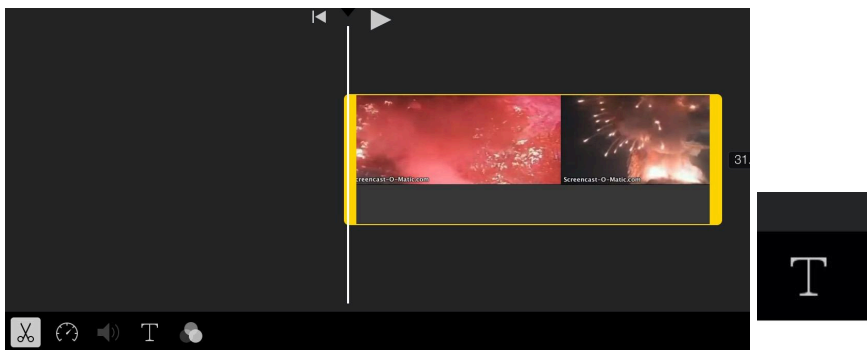
Next you will need to select the video and add introductory **text** to it as well as **credits** at the end. Remember that you will need to add the [information you collected](#) on the volcano video you chose.

#### You will need:

The name of the video from Youtube (use the shortened url to open it.)

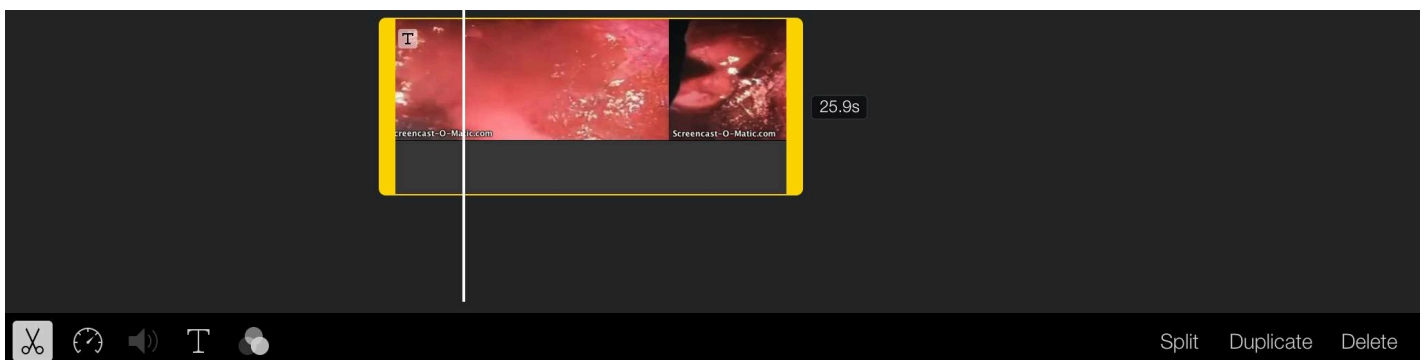
The name of the user who uploaded it to Youtube

The shortened url for the video or if you prefer the original, long url.



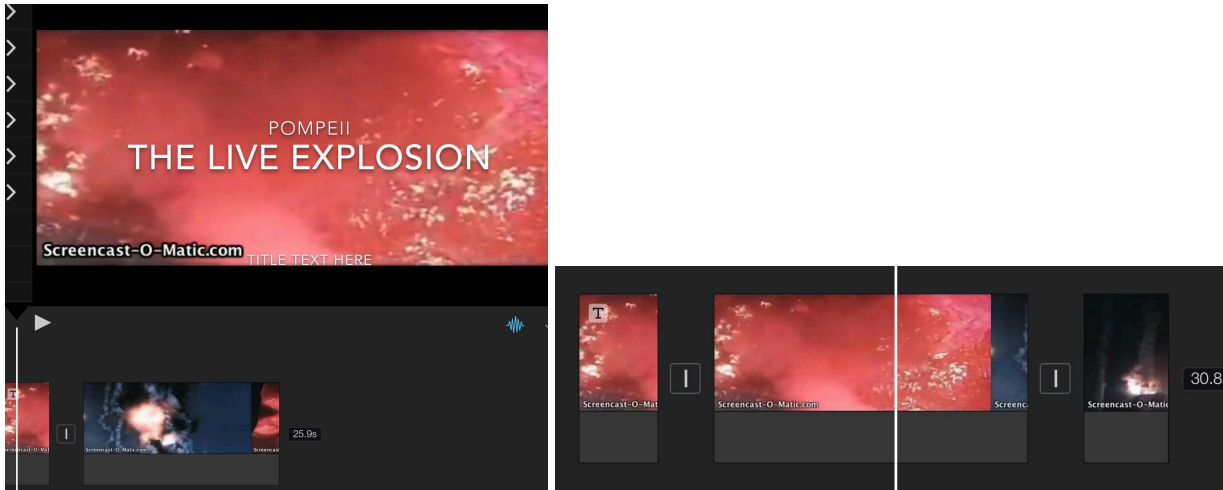
In order for the text to appear for only a short time you will need to **split** the clip twice, once a few seconds after the beginning and once a few seconds before the end.

Notice that when the scissors are selected the **Split** option becomes available. Choose a location a few seconds into the video to split your clip and isolate the **Title** and introductory text.





The first split will look something like this.



Split it one more time before the end of the video and add in your credits.

**Remember:** that you will need to add the [information you collected](#) on the volcano video you chose.

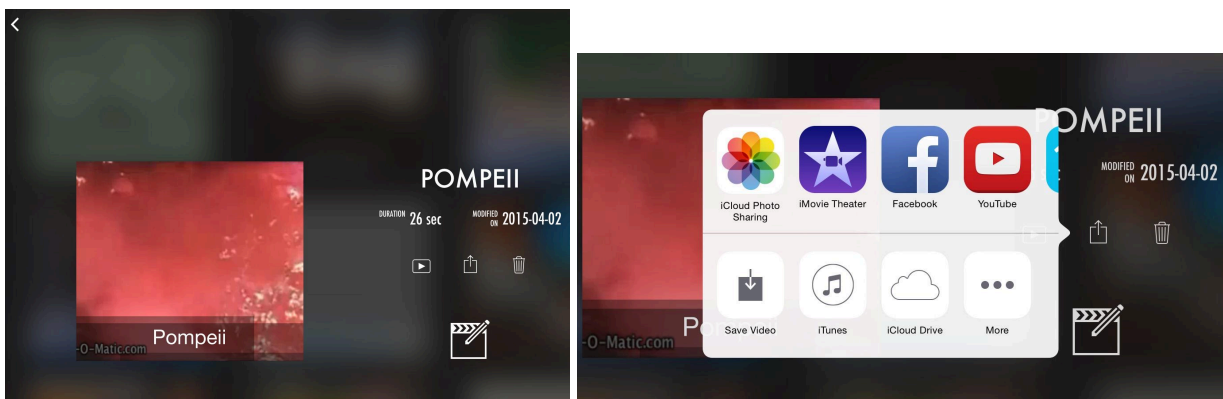

The name of the video from Youtube (use the shortened url to open it.)

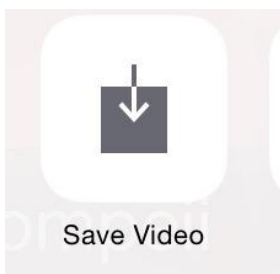
The name of the user who uploaded it to Youtube

Next you will need to download the video to the **Camera Roll**. Use the back arrow to leave the editor and click on the **share** option as shown below.



**Use the Save Video option to put it in the Camera Roll.**



You now have all of your media in the camera roll and are ready for the final steps.

## DoInk

You will put your video together using a cool green screen video editor called DoInk.



This application works with **layers**.

Think for the moment about your media. Which is the back layer? Which should be in the middle and which should be at the front?

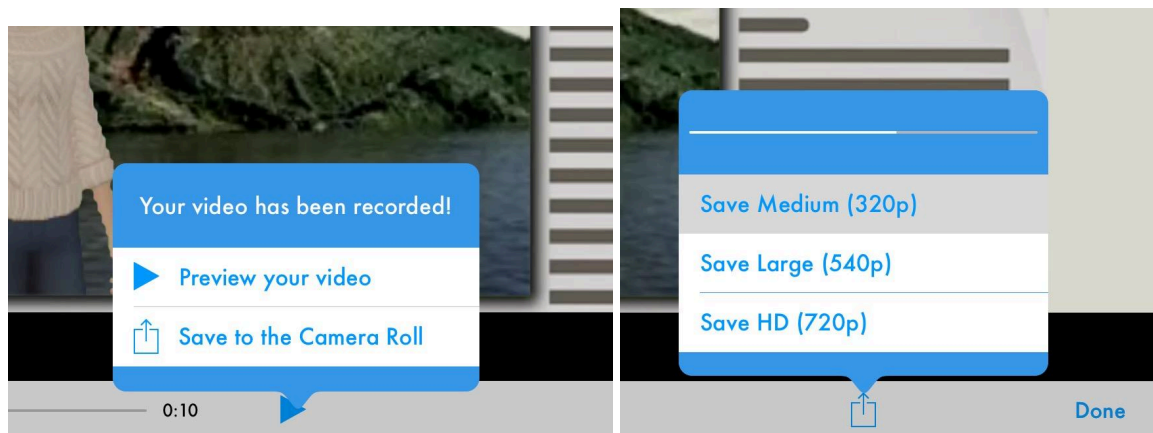

Once you have finished **editing** your video, **download** it as shown in the images below.



Your final task will to be to go to Google Drive on the iPad and upload your video to the folder.
