New classes for Semester 2 - 2022

History through the eyes of the individual (0.5 credit Grades 10 - 12) -Available during B & H classes

This semester-long course will examine the role of an individual on history. The class will cover major topics/events of the 20th century and the role of the individual within these events. Topics may include, but are not limited to WWI, The Great Depression, WWII, Decolonization, The Red Scare, and the social movements of the late 20th century. The idea of legacy and narrative will be examined and if, in fact, one person can have a profound impact on history.

Environmental Art and Design (0.5 credit Grades 9-12) -Available during C classes

This semester- long course is centered on creating awareness of environmental issues through the creation and analysis of nature based art and design. This course will examine the international art movements loosely grouped under the umbrella term, Environmental Art, such as, Land Art, Earth Art, Sustainable Art, and Eco-Art. We will trace the historical development of these movements from the 1960's to the conceptual artists working within these fields today. The two primary concerns of this course are: to understand the historical and current environmental concerns that have given rise to such art, and understand the ways in which artists have sought to intervene in and affect a changing environment. Units of study may include, but are not limited to, Sustainable/Slow Fashion, Ephemeral Art, Nature Photography and Field Journaling.
