



General remarks:

*(1) **Sentences that apply to more than one topic:** There are a good number of sentences whose content may include more than one topic, idea, argument or defined group of concepts. In such cases, the sentence is assigned to the theme that seems to us to be the most prominent within the text. But, in some isolated cases, when it seems to us the best option, we duplicate the sentence so that it appears at the same time in the two or more assigned topics.*

*(2) **About certain repetitions:** Some of the topics, and therefore of their respective quotes, aphorisms or maxims, are exposed both in the ByAuthor division and in ByTopic, although not always the totality of the quotes of the same topic. This occurs mainly between these two divisions but we may also sporadically find some duplicate quotes in other sections. We have preferred the option of presenting them simultaneously in different locations so that the individualized reading of each section or division is always complete by itself.*

*(3) **On the method of study:** The method proposed in ByStudyGuide may be useful for some people interested in "these matters", however, it may also not be useful or attractive enough for others even if they have the same interest. It is necessary to remember here, once again, that each of us has in our unique path, our particular way of, so to speak, absorbing knowledge of this magnitude, of internalizing it, of understanding it.*
