Food and Drug Administration: Broiler Chickens

Artificial coloring and flavoring and scent (scent marketing)

BGH – Bovine Growth Hormone

FDA standards - i.e. amount of feces that is acceptable

<u>Meat substitute</u> – mechanically separated meat, <u>meat "filler" in tacos</u>

Pill substitutes for the "real" thing - opiates and antibiotics

E-Cigs and **Cigarettes**

BEAUTY & HEALTH

<u>Plastic surgery</u> – face lifts, tummy tucks, <u>botox</u>

Enlargements, enhancements, reductions, lipo

Reconstructive surgery – <u>artificial limbs</u>, organs, etc.

<u>Tanning</u> - tanning beds, tan in a can, etc.

Hair color (extensions, wigs), straighteners and curlers, permanent make-up
