Diwali

What is it?	Religious Harvest Festival celebrated in Hinduism, Jainism, Sikhism, and Buddhism. Countries with a large concentration of these religions are India, Pakistan, and other Southeast Asia countries.
When is it?	Five days typically in October or November. The dates vary yearly as this holiday follows a lunar calendar.
How is it Celebrated Outside the U.S?	 Five days of traditions surrounding cleaning houses, attending religious services, family gatherings, fireworks, and more. Also known as A Festival of Lights with oil lamps, lights, and collages are made into displays in front of homes and other structures. Schools and businesses are often closed or have adjusted hours.
How Does This Impact Schools?	Increased absences.
How are Schools Responding?	 Avoid scheduling family nights during Diwali. Allow for different appointment times for Parent Teacher Conferences Remove consequences due to absences Provide opportunities for the school community to learn about more diverse holidays (including other events surrounding lights or the harvest).
