Dear Parents, Guardians, and Staff Members,
I am writing to share information about radon testing at your school. As a part of our environmental safety program, Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) periodically tests for radon levels in our schools.
The most recent test results indicate that all rooms and offices tested at your school had radon levels below The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) recommended an action limit of 4.0 picocuries per liter of air (pCi/L). No mitigation is required at this time . Periodic testing will continue on the schedule described above.
