- We are still part of our communities back home even after deportation and return.
Visa Justice Now!
- Overstaying visas - NO!
Mobility for deported and returned folks between our communities in Mexico and the U.S. - YES!
Visa Justice Now!
- We don't want to immigrate and overstay our visas, we want mobility between our communities and families in Mexico and the US.
- Prior presence in the USA and existing family network within the United States is not on its own a reason to deny an individual a nonimmigrant visa.
- Having lived in the U.S. and having an existing family network there should be a positive reason to grant visas and waivers to deported and returned individuals rather than criminalizing them and impeding them from a just family reunification.
- In B1/B2 visa applications, almost every ground of inadmissibility – except for terrorism and national security– CAN be waived.
- Immediate creation of the U.S. Embassy and Consulate directives that require officers to consider temporary family reunification of returned and deported individuals as a positive discretionary factor at the time of issuing non-immigrant visas.
- Under current policies, applicants must overcome the presumption of guilt, of lying, of being an “intending immigrant” in order to receive a nonimmigrant visa to travel.
- STOP the accusations of hidden “immigrant intent”. Visa Justice and Mobility for All
- Immediate creation of waivers for automatic bars for those seeking both immigrant and non-immigrant visas.
- Dismantle racist US Immigration legislation and Consular Affairs policies and practices.

- Unfair US Consular policies continue to police our right to international mobility.
- Eliminate the 3 and 10 year bars for unlawful presence and illegal re-entry that are in the 1996 Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigration Responsibility Act.
- Support the initiative A Chance to Come Home. This would create a process for people previously ordered deported to apply to come home.
- We have been waiting in line. What else can we do to “prove” our right to mobility? #End214b
- Having family and community in the US shouldn’t equal criminalization. End 214b
