## MINUTES FOR POPLAR RIDGE MONTHLY MEETING FOR BUSINESS DECEMBER 15, 2019

Gather: present were: Christopher Sammond, Paul Simkin, Ruth Bradley, Charlie Weld, Sally Otis, Stephanie Nelson, Dill Otis, Hannah Richter, Howard Nelson. We began with some silence.

November minutes: minutes were read.

Treasurer's Report: Ruth distributed copies of "2019 Budget Summary with 2020 Draft." YTD contributions: \$35,464, approx. 76% of budgeted amount. Response to the appeals letter has been robust, and contributions are still coming in. Sally asked about motto calendars, which have not been ordered yet. Paul will discuss this with Jane, who is currently in charge of motto calendar distribution.

2020 Budget: The budget as proposed last month was presented. Figure for Outreach should be changed to \$200. With this correction, the budget as proposed was approved. Ruth pointed out that the fund balance decreased from 2018 to 2019: \$93,140.28 to \$77,079.72. The question was asked whether there is some level we are aiming to maintain. It was agreed that Finance Committee will be asked to study this question.

Ruth noted that she will check with the Finance Committee about which account the \$30,000 investment in Friends Fiduciary Short Term Investment Fund should be drawn from.

Clearness for Membership: Dill represented the Clearness Committee for Dean Faiello's application for membership. The committee met with Dean on December 13. Charlie thanked the committee for its work, and

reminded us that recommendations normally go to M&C before Monthly Meeting. Action on the application will be referred to M&C, and Dean will be advised that his application will be taken up at the January meetings of M&C and MM, via a letter from Hannah as Clerk of the Meeting.

Announcements: Christopher announced an on-line forum sponsored by NYYM, "Virtual Workshop: Q & A with Quaker Organizations & Groups," Wednesday, December 18, 7:30.

The meeting closed with some silence.

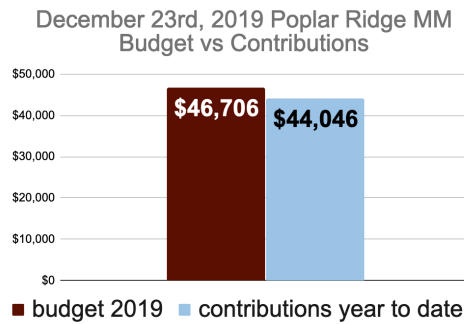
