What has God revealed?	General Revelation	Special Revelation	Special Revelation

Historic Christianity	Creation	Fall	Redemption (Restoration, Sanctification, Glorification)
Schaeffer	"The universe and it's forms" "The manishness of man"	Verbalized propositional statements in Scripture "Man's dilemma"	Verbalized propositional statements in Scripture "Christ plus nothing"
Schaeffer's 3 Bows	Man must admit that he is not autonomous	Man must admit that he has true moral guilt, and that he has broken moral absolutes	Man must accept Christ as redeemer, "Christ plus nothing."

Effects on the Human Conscience →	Diminished level of the value of life.	A mind void of judgment.	Elevation of self worth or a general devaluing of the intellect.
Various Effects on the Human World of Thought →	Arbitrary judgments on human lives (Abortion, Genocide)	Ethical Relativism Religious Pluralism	False optimism "man is the measure of all things" or absolute pessimism "life is meaningless" and disillusionment with world systems

## Schaeffer's Emphasis On The Whole Man

Some perceive that Schaeffer is only about the intellect. He is not, he is reasserting the intellect in an era that has forgotten the balance.

Heart-felt Spirituality	Upper Story	Organizational Unity	Love without Truth (Doctrinal Compromise)	Tends toward mysticism (belief without content) and anarchy (belief without law)
Mind-felt Spirituality	Lower Story	Doctrinal Unity	Truth without Love (Doctrine Without Love)	Tends toward scholasticism (cold academics) and legalism (impersonal law)
The Whole Person	The Supernatural nature of the universe	Balance of Organizational Unity & Doctrinal	Difficulty discerning the balance	When practiced rightly, properly demonstrated Christ.
