Course Description

In 3rd Grade Reading–Language Arts (RLA), students deepen foundational skills through the exploration of a wide range of literary and informational texts. Instruction focuses on strengthening comprehension, expanding vocabulary, and enhancing written expression. Students engage with fiction, nonfiction, poetry, drama, argumentative texts, traditional literature, and extended novels. This curriculum aligns to the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) and encourages critical thinking and communication through reading and writing.

- Develop drafts with clear introductions, supporting details, and conclusions.



- Use transitions effectively and revise for coherence and clarity.
- Craft constructed responses citing text evidence.

Grammar & Conventions

- Use correct capitalization, punctuation, and grammar in writing.
- Apply parts of speech: nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, pronouns, and prepositions.
- Construct compound sentences and apply subject-verb agreement.
- Edit for verb tenses, contractions, apostrophes, and commas in a series.
