Abstracts are written in two languages, English and Indonesian. Use Times New Roman with size 11 pt and single spacing—maximum 250 words. Abstracts are written in English (abstracts in English are italicized).

Keyword: Variables studied and other things deemed necessary

INTRODUCTION (12 pts)

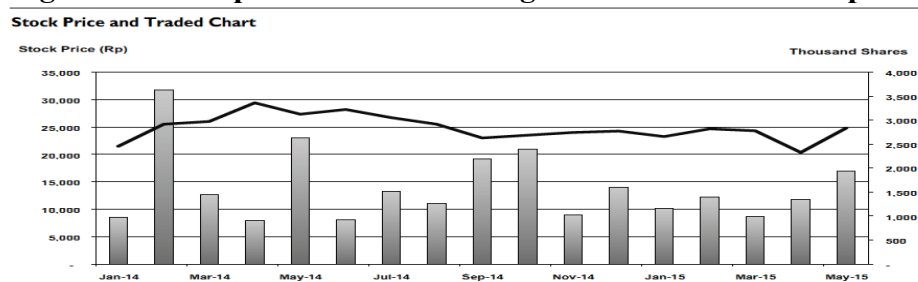
The introduction generally contains the background of the problem, phenomena, previous research, theory, and objectives related to the primary research. It is written in flowing paragraph form and does not use subtitles, bullets, or numbering in the introduction. Examples of quotes are Anton and Wawan (2017). Write tables and figures in the format below.

LITERATURE REVIEW (12 pts)

This section contains theories and literature studies related to the research object. The hypothesis is built by previous research and studies related to the research. Previous research must be by the research subject.

RESEARCH METHODS (12 pts)

This section contains the research design used (methods, data types, data sources, data collection techniques, data analysis techniques, variable measurement) written in

flowing paragraph form (no bullets or numbering).

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION (12 pts)

Contains the results of empirical research or theoretical studies written systematically, critically analyzed, and informative. The use of tables, figures, etc., is only as support to clarify the discussion and is limited to genuinely substantial support, for example, tables of statistical test results, images of model test results, etc. The table presented is not a processed statistical output but is an informative summary of the results.

In the discussion section, the results are argumentative regarding the relevance of the results, theory, previous research, empirical facts found, and the novelty of the findings.

CONCLUSION (12 pts)

It contains a conclusion with a broad summary of the discussion of research results written briefly and clearly, showing the clarity of the contribution of the findings, the emergence of new theories, and the possibility of developing research that can be carried out in the future. The flowing paragraphs include theoretical and practical implications, limitations, and research suggestions.

REFERENCES (12 pts)

The references must be arranged alphabetically and then sorted chronologically using Mendeley or ZOTERO with APA Style.
