Week 6

CT scan - A CT scan shows detailed pictures of the organs and tissues inside your body. A medical examination that uses a computer to produce an image of the inside of somebody's body from X-ray or ultrasound pictures

PET scan - A PET scan uses a tiny amount of radioactive material called a radiotracer, a camera, and a computer to create images of the inside of your body. A PET scan shows a doctor how your tissues and organs work.

Tissues is a collection of cells that form the different parts of humans, animals and plants.

Week 10

1Stella Young was a comedian and journalist who happened to go about her day in a wheelchair. In this funny talk, Stella Young, who had a **low-key upbringing** in a small town, reflects on her life experiences, particularly after being **nominated** for a community achievement award at the age of 15.

²Growing up, she engaged in normal activities but found herself **objectified** as an inspiration solely due to her disability.

Když vyrůstala, účastnila se obyčejných aktivit, ale měla pocit, že je inspirací jen kvůli svému postižení.

3She criticizes the **propagation** of what she terms "inspirational porn," images that **exceptionalize** disabled individuals for the benefit of non-disabled people. Ona kritizuje propagaci něčeho, čemu říká inspirativní porno, obrázky, které vyjímají postižené osoby pro ve prospěch intaktních lidí.

4Embracing the social model of disability, she emphasizes that societal attitudes and barriers pose greater challenges than the actual impairments.

- Přijmutím sociálního modelu postižení zdůrazňuje, že společenský postoj a překážky představují větší výzvy, než samotné postižení.
- 5 The speaker challenges the **notion** that disability makes someone exceptional, **advocating** for a world where disability is normalized, achievements are valued **genuinely**, and low expectations for disabled individuals are overcome.

 - j. Not to see someone's complexity and humanity, but to focus solely on external aspects.
