## The Response of the Royal Society of Ulster Architects (RSUA) to the 'One Stop Shop' Implementation Plan Consultation

31 January 2023

### Introduction

The Royal Society of Ulster Architects (RSUA) is the professional body for architects based in Northern Ireland. We have 870 chartered members and over 300 student members. RSUA strives to enhance the region's built environment for the benefit of all through the promotion of architecture.

RSUA welcomes the opportunity to respond to the consultation on the 'One Stop Shop' implementation plan.

#### 1. Do you agree with the Energy One Stop Shop underpinning principles?

RSUA believes that an overriding issue with the 'one stop shop' is that there is no diagram/demonstration of where the 'one stop shop' will exist within or alongside existing organisations, and how it sits relative to the Climate Act. Examples of existing organisations are the Consumer Council and Utility Regulator and the Northern Ireland Housing Executive through its Energy Advice Service.

RSUA requests clarification on is 'one stop shop' a working title or the planned title to go ahead. As concerns have been raised that if the consultation is to be named 'one stop shop' it actually needs to be a 'one stop shop'. Otherwise, the consultations name needs to be changed to focus on what it plans to deliver.

RSUA believes that the 'One Stop Shop' should focus on providing a new service to users. For example, the 'One Stop Shop' could act as a source of where users can find relevant services or be an amalgamation of existing services already available through other organisations.

RSUA believes that the use of the Republic of Ireland example (2.3) referenced in the 'one stop shop' consultation was helpful.

RSUA recognises that the areas the 'one stop shop' is targeting and planning to cover is positive (3.12). However, RSUA believes that the list of areas that the 'one-stop shop' is not covering is of concern. For example, handle complaints, act as a regulator, promote products, services or brands and so on. Since the 'one stop shop' is not covering these areas then who is, if anyone, taking care of those areas. RSUA believes if the 'One Stop Shop' is not covering certain areas it should instead provide links to those who do.

While RSUA agrees with the above statement we ask for clarification that the services 'one stop shop' is aiming to cover is not a duplicate of already existing services. For example, one of the strategic objectives of the 'one stop shop' is to provide advice to the public. However, in section 3.13 it is recognised that the Consumer Council already does exactly this and advises consumers. Similarly, The Department for Communities currently funds the Northern Ireland Housing Executive to run the Energy Advice Service. RSUA believes efficiency is key and 'one stop shop' will need to either provide something new or an integrated system of all the services the government provides.
