Course Request / Schedule Change Policy

Every attempt will be made to give the student the requested classes. Electives are subject to availability. Staffing and instructional materials needed are based on student enrollment, therefore, **schedule changes will not occur after March 21, 2025.**

A student may request a transfer from an AP/Honors class at the end of 4 weeks in the first grading period of the academic school year. However, please be aware that transfers will only be granted if the following criteria are met:

1. the requesting student's current grade in the AP/Honors course is below a 70
2. space is available in the corresponding on-grade level course for credit
3. the requesting student has a documented history of attending tutorials for the current AP/Honors course
4. the AP/Honors teacher determines if all criteria have been met and forwards the Guyer HS AP/Honors Drop Form to the student and parent/guardian.

If all the criteria are met, the requesting student and his or her parent/guardian must complete and submit the Guyer HS AP/Honors Drop Form within the designated timeline.

An email reminding students to verify course selection in HAC will be sent in the spring. **Changes to course requests will not be accepted after March 21, 2025.**
