Course Title: \$hmoney Skills for College

Course Description

This course aims to equip young and gifted individuals with practical and actionable financial skills to secure foundational financial health to get to and through college. The course addresses four key areas typically missing from daily conversations in efforts to permanently change the narrative of the racial wealth gap on future youth generations: understanding student loans and financial aid, managing money, establishing credit responsibility and identifying post-grad career paths.

Course Outcomes

- Apply a framework to self-advocate for college affordability by maximizing non-repayable financial aid options before and during enrollment
- Develop money management skills with a goal-driven budget framework using banking products, fintech automations and budgeting
- Adopt actionable habits to establish credit responsibility and a strong credit history foundation
- Identify potential career outcomes to consider post-grad based on college experiences and economic-driving skillsets
