Ms. Simmons welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced the staff.

Purpose of Title I, MAP Data first and second grades, Overview of Mastery Predictive Assessment #2, Lexia Data, Review Parent and Teacher Survey Results

Mrs. Pessolano presented the MAP data for first and second grade. In ELA and Math for first grade we were over 40% above the National Norm. We had a question if this was a national comparison or just Greenville. It is a national comparison.

Dr. Loren Simmons presented the Mastery Predictive Assessment #2 data. In ELA our goal is 50.2% and we are at 41.4%. In Math our goal is 39.1% and we are at 42.3%. We are a little over the goal. They asked: Is this how they are doing right now? Yes! They asked: Where can they look at this data more? The presentation is posted to the school website. They were shown where to find it. Dr. Simmons showed our Lexia data on usage and how many skills have been mastered. Question was asked how long they work on Lexia per week. It is 30 minutes twice a week.

Mrs. Heatherly reviewed the Parent and Teacher surveys. No questions were asked about the surveys.

SIC/BookQuest:

Elaine Naradowski shared The 10,000 Book Challenge. The books can be books they read, storybook youtube (ScanSource will head this up.), and Story Online. A discussion on how to track-decided to use a paper

form for k-2 and a google form for 3-5 grades. Another discussion on the number of books read to get a prize. We decided to use the school store for a reward and ScanSource will work on a plan for rewards. They will send it out for us to review. We decided to use Adventure Map for displaying the number of books read. We will have guest readers (March 6 for k-2) and ask them about being a mystery reader. The Imagination Station Expo is a science fair-style event where 5th graders showcase their favorite books through posters, videos, or interactive displays. We will keep the book fair.
