We love cinema

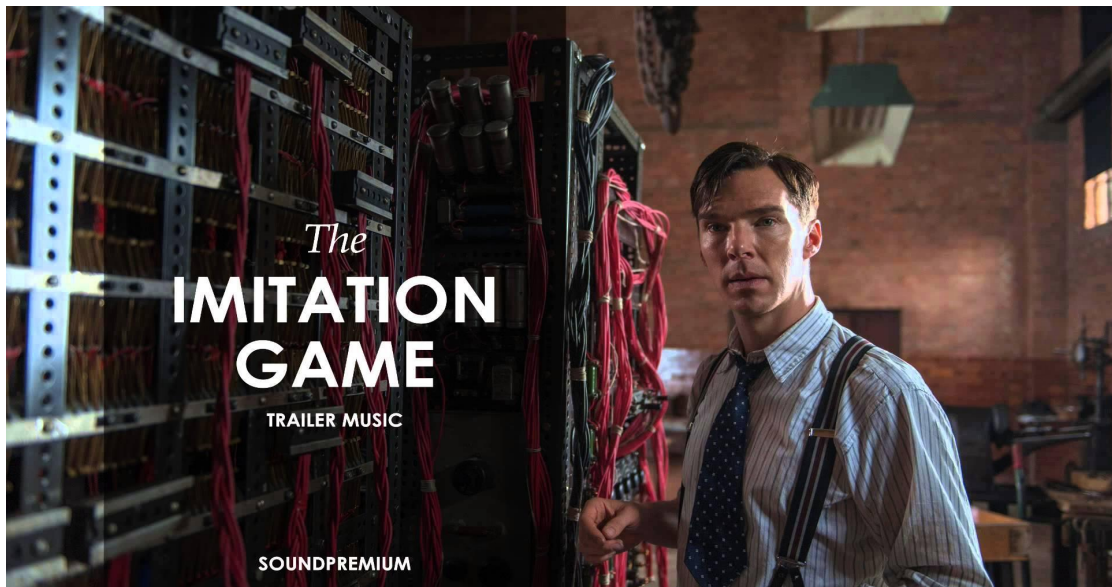
On December 1, in our school, students had the opportunity to attend a presentation about the life and the work of the British mathematician Alan Turing and

watch the film "the imitation game" which describes his efforts to crack the Enigma code.

Alan Turing is considered to be the father of the theoretical computer science. Working for Government Code and Cypher School at Bletchley Park, during the World War II, he created a machine, «the bombe», which was capable to break the code messages that Germans were sending through the Enigma machine.



"The Imitation Game", released in 2014, is a historical drama film directed by Morten Tyldum and based on the biography of Alan Turing "The Enigma" by Andrew Hodges.



After the movie, students had the opportunity to discuss on the way that Turing helped, through his work, to end the World War II and additionally on the way that the conservative British law faced his sexual identity.
