Fees for appointments are based on a sliding scale.

Please read to the end of this page to determine your appropriate fee. This requires your participation.

Creating an equitable sliding scale helps build economic justice. What is economic justice? It's the **idea that the economy will be more successful if it is fairer**. The goal is to create opportunities for all to thrive and that prosperity and justice go hand-in-hand rather than in opposition to one another. **The goal of this type of sliding scale is to provide broader accessibility for services and products, while still ensuring fair compensation to the provider.** If done well, everyone pays a similar percentage of their income for the same products or services. This creates a more equitable system overall.

Typically choosing where you fall on a sliding scale is determined by your income level. If you make more money, you can pay more for services. There are however, many factors that contribute to certain groups of people having more costs, not having access to certain resources, or not being paid the same amount for the same job. I have created a chart below to help you determine where you might fall on this sliding scale. When you choose your payment, take into consideration factors such as class, gender identity, and or race, which influence your earning potential in our current system.

CALCULATING ANNUAL INCOME	
Start with your annual income. If you don't know your annual income, take your monthly income and multiply by 12.	
You can always contact me if you are at the bottom of the income chart and still need assistance. There are additional considerations in an additional chart below.	
ANNUAL INCOME	FEE FOR SESSION
Under \$20,000	\$50

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

CONSIDER PAYING LESS

- Have significant debt
- Experience discrimination in hiring or pay level
- Are descended from enslaved people or Native American Indians (I recognize that much of my privilege has come at the expense of these communities)
- Have significant medical expenses not covered by insurance
- Are supporting children or have other dependents
- Are eligible for public assistance
- Have immigration-related expenses
- Are an elder with limited financial support
- Are an unpaid community organizer
- Are a returning citizen who has been denied work due to incarceration history
- Are a teacher K-12 and sometimes pay for students supplies

CONSIDER PAYING FULL PRICE OR MORE

- Own the home you live in
- Have investments, retirement accounts, or inherited money
- Travel for recreation or when needed
- Have access to family money and resources in times of need
- Work part time or are unemployed by choice, including unemployment due to full-time school in a degree-earning program
- Have a relatively high degree of earning power due to level of education (or gender and racial privilege, class background, etc.) Even if you are not currently exercising your earning power, I ask you to recognize this as a choice
- Have daily reliable transportation
- Have a relatively high degree of earning power due to level of education (or gender and racial privilege, class background, etc.)

This is intended to be a guide map.

It's everyone's responsibility to take inventory of their financial resources and look deeper at their levels of privilege or systemic barriers that affect all of us. If you fall somewhere in between these two categories, consider paying near the asking price. You can select a price that works for you during registration. No questions asked or explanations needed. I just ask that you are honest. If you are paying in person and need to adjust the asking price for financial reasons, let me know at the end of your session and you choose the amount based on the factors presented above. If you pay less for services, one way of giving back are referrals if you value what I do. It's always appreciated and also supportive.
