### Canva

- "One thing that you can do with Canva for broadcasting is graphics for newscast, or finding backgrounds for greenscreen (and its background removing tool kind of eliminates the need for greenscreen in editing, too)"

  - "I actually modified one of the StoryMaker lesson presentations and made it a Pear Deck. I like using it for student engagement—even the quieter kids who don't usually volunteer to share were typing their ideas about questions that might have led to specific sound bites." Adison Godfrey

I'd say multiple AI tools - ChatGPT, MagicSchool AI, Adobe Firefly, AI apps in Canva, Gemini, are a few.

But my favorite "new" tool - the DJI OSMO Pocket 3 Creator Combo. That combined with the DJI Mic 2, is such a game changer for portable storytelling! -Tara B.

Notebook LM is wild. It can turn a handout or any document into a podcast. It is an interesting way to introduce an topic or assignment. The downside is the podcast style speaks to adults. It doesn't resonate as much with the kids. But it is a cool tool. Just depends on how you use it. I will link the podcast it created from a Film Challenge handout/assignment I gave my kids.-James Flanagan

I've really leaned into Canva for a lot, especially making last minute news announcement and quick b-roll.

Also, love DJI osmo phone gimbals.- Elaine

The biggest cinematic game changer for my students was 50mm fixed lenses. Hallway shots now look beautiful with a very shallow depth of field where before they just looked like ugly hallways.-Michael Kaufman

Mimicking the others to say that Canva is really great. We also use Adobe Express but I feel like it's clunkier than Canva. The little phone mics have been great. They're cheap, kids love using them and they just plug in to the phone and go. And finally, we got two Canon mirrorless r50's this year and LOVE them so much. And we've mostly used the 50mm lens as well-Jen Chaffman

Hands down the best mics on the market for what we teach are the DJI mics. I always had issues with background noise with the Rode mics. DJI is top of the game at the moment.-AJ Chambers

Of course, I always use RØDE Microphones for their durability and StoryMaker which helped students move from "I have an idea" to "I have a story."-Sequoah

Padlet and Canva are both winning tools for me!-Anita

For me I have a wireless mic for iPhones that is awesome.-Mindy Pavone

We definitely rely on our DJI gimbals and mics so students can use their cell phones for accessible, mobile storytelling. Without those, we'd be stuck with very old equipment with footage that takes longer to edit/publish.-Morgan Bricker

Canva has definitely been my tool of the year.

Cleaning up and standardizing all of my production forms for students.-Mike Bartozek

Padlet is the best for organizing webs and working together at the same time on pitches, leads, and even setting up the teleprompter. It is seriously our right hand in the studio production. I even pay for it, yes, I need it that bad!-Heather Putnam

Y'all, narrowing this down felt like choosing a favorite child. But here we go... this year has been a game-changer thanks to a dream team of tools:

JEA Curriculum: My go-to for structure, skill-building, and keeping us aligned with real-world journalism.

MagicSchool AI + ChatGPT: Used responsibly (and creatively!), these tools helped me and my students brainstorm, outline, write tighter, and think critically about ethical media use.

Canva + ClearTouch: Watching students literally build yearbook pages together in real-time while collaborating on our big screen? Chef's kiss.

And the MVP? Our Frankenstein's monster of a tripod: it holds the iPad, mic, light, camera and laptop. It's basically a portable broadcast studio. We call it The Beast.

All of these tools brought structure to the chaos and made student-led storytelling not just possible, but powerful.

YoLo Pro has been an incredible tool that has expanded our production capabilites. We are liberated from the locked down studio. The ability to Live Stream, record and Live Switch multiple cameras with a device smaller than an ipad has been a real game-changer.-Phil Scardilli
