<u>Key clauses in contracts issued by some outlets - regarding payment, serial rights, warranties, indemnification:</u>

[Note 1: Nothing in this document constitutes legal advice, including this section. Many outlets do not issue contracts for assignments. If they do, here's more information on contracts that better protect writers.

Note 2: **Indemnification clauses**: some writers say they ask for permission to strike out any indemnification clause in a contract, or don't ask but strike it out before signing and hope no one at the publication cares or notices, or modify the clause to pertain only to breaches proven in a court of law, not to any breach or claim. Some writers say they modify indemnification language about any alleged breach to exclude claims relating to editorial changes made by publisher, or limiting indemnity to final judgments for damages for breach.

An indemnity or indemnification clause that some writers report asking for instead: "The Writer guarantees that the Article will not contain material that is *consciously* libelous or defamatory. In return, the Publisher agrees to provide and pay for counsel to defend the Writer in any litigation arising as a result of the Article."

Note 3: Warranty clauses for privacy and other rights infringements also concern some writers. A possible modification, some writers say, could include adding "intentionally" to a clause stating that writer warranties not to violate privacy etc. rights.

Note 4: Material below is from various reports and sources, not verified.]

American History magazine - total rights grab, no negotiations

Anthropocene - pay upon acceptance; owns first worldwide serial rights

Ars Technica/Conde Nast - payment upon acceptance, 25% kill fee; 90-days exclusive first worldwide rights, possibly for all work for Conde, but one person negotiated it to pertain just to single story being sold; company owns copyright but one person negotiated so the writer owned copyright after 90-days exclusive rights expire; privacy and defamation warranty; nothing about indemnification though

Columbia Journalism Review - Pay within 90 days

Eos - pay on acceptance; first electronic rights to publish the Article in an electronic format on the Eos website and to archive the article there in perpetuity. The article will be published under the terms of the Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivs 3.0 license whereby others can share the work as long as they provide proper credit but cannot change the work in any way or use it commercially; indemnify Eos against any and all third party claims, actions, damages, expenses.

Guardian - all rights and options granted by you in this Licence shall subsist throughout the world in any language(s) on an exclusive basis for three (3) months following first publication by GNM ("Exclusivity Period") and thereafter on a non-exclusive basis for the remaining period of copyright in your Commissioned Contribution including all renewals, reversions, extensions and revivals of such period, the Exclusivity Period and remaining period of copyright thereafter together being the "Term".

Hearst - reportedly retains all rights, non-negotiable

High Country News - pay on publication; can pay in advance if you ask; kill fee 25% if editors decide for any reason not to publish; 30-day non-compete for all media including author interviews on same or similar subject

Knowable - "any knowing or willful breach" (seems better than standard warranty clauses)

MIT Technology Review - Writer retains ownership, publication has exclusive right to publish for first 6 months

National Geographic - pay within 40 days; will bump up pay on request; work-for-hire; reportedly retains all rights (books, movies, TV, etc.) in perpetuity, all formats, non-negotiable; indemnify National Geo against any and all third party claims, actions, damages, expenses.

National Public Radio - invoice on acceptance; pay within 30 days of receipt of invoice; 7 days exclusive all-rights; warranty that work does not violate IP, privacy, or publicity rights of others; Freelancer shall indemnify NPR...against claims, damages, liabilities, costs, and expenses, including attorney fees, that result from any breach

Scientific American - pay within 30 days; 25% kill fee; embargo for other stories on same topic - 90 days; "in connection with any claim or lawsuit arising from the work...you will cooperate with Scientific American and provide any documents requested"

Spectrum - Spectrum pays within 30 days within receipt of invoice, writer retains rights after 30 days, no indemnity clause, 50% kill fee.

The New York Times - Times owns all rights...throughout the world; Times has perpetual, worldwide, royalty-free, paid-up, non-exclusive transferable license under copyright to reproduce, distribute, display, perform, translate or otherwise publish your work...in any form or media; warranty that work will not violate any person's rights, including the right or privacy; 14 days from publication - you will not permit any article with Times competitor on a similar subject matter w/o prior editor approval; "upon publication of the materials, you will be paid the amount agreed upon."

The New Yorker - reportedly retains all rights (books, movies, TV, etc.)

The Wall Street Journal - reportedly will allow modifications of indemnification clause if you ask

The Washington Post - you indemnify the Post and hold Post harmless from liabilities, costs, expenses

Undark - writer retains rights after 90 days

Vox Media - Pay every 15th of month; 25% kill fee; work for hire; retains all rights
