1. Went over vocab [Hawaiian Starter Vocab - Verbs 1 & 2] and pronunciation

2. Reviewed material from Event #1 & Event #2:

- -He aha kēlā? He kāne uluhua kēlā.
- -Pehea 'oe? Maika'i au. / Pehea 'o ia? Kaumaha 'o ia. / Pehea ka wahine? Hau'oli ka wahine.

3. Learned:

Verbs are words conveying action. In Hawaiian, they come first in the sentence, similar to Adjectives.

Formula: Verb + Noun/Pronoun

= Noun/Pronoun [verb]s

Ex.

Mana'o au = I think Ho'ohana 'o ia = He uses

4. Learned:

Ke = The [Definite Article], when behind nouns starting with K, E, A, or O.

Ex.

Ke kāne = The man / Ke keiki = The child / Ke kaikamahine = The girl Ka 'ao'ao = The page [technically starts with ', not A]

Pronouns (talking about 3 or more people) -

Kākou = We [including speaker]

Mākou = We [excluding speaker]

'Oukou = You all

Lākou = They

Ex.

Hana kākou = We work

Ho'opa'a ha'awina mākou = We study

Makemake 'oukou = You all want

Hoʻomākaukau lākou = They prepare

→ Practiced using visuals in Powerpoint: He aha ka hana? (= What is the activity / What are they doing?)
