 - **duckgoesoink says: I think the FAQ page could definitely be improved - there are so many questions in there that it's currently hard to navigate. Here are my suggestions:**
 - the contents menu at the top of the page should be collapsible (eg. using jQuery) to make it easier to scan - at the moment all categories are bunched together.
 - The headings General, Using Inkscape, Troubleshooting Inkscape etc. should be large and visible - following the header styles throughout the site.
 - Headings need good spacing between them, and no bullet points. They also need to be obviously "clickable" - perhaps a grey background, or a small arrow icon, etc.
 - When headings are clicked, the list of navigable FAQs for that particular section will fade & slide in to view.
 - When an individual question is clicked, the page will slide down (eg. using jQuery) to the appropriate answer - this helps the user understand where they are in the page (sometimes long pages with internal anchors can confuse users' orientation within a page).
 - needs far more white space between each question, with 1px grey border between each one for visual

differentiation.

- “Back to Top” links for each question (*I know the clicking the title of each question takes the user to the menu, but that’s not intuitive enough*).
 - headers for each answer should be larger, to aid visual hierarchy.

 - Display Testimonials
 - ADD new testimonials
 - Name
 - Company Name (if applicable)
 - URL
 - Small paragraph
 - Date (automatically grab)
- Download
 - Official releases
 - Development versions

 - Needs to be a neat way to display the content currently found here

 - Tutorials
 - Needs to allow for submission of tutorials
 - ***duckgoesoink says: I’d say a mix of both would be cool, but I prefer to have them hosted on the site and yes they would be in moderation -Inc***
