Artifact: Confederate States of America Ten-Dollar Note

This Certificate of Authenticity verifies that the accompanying artifact is an original Confederate States of America paper currency note issued during the American Civil War (1861–1865).

Condition Assessment

This ten-dollar note is preserved in excellent condition, with strong paper integrity, clear printing, and minimal signs of circulation.

Historical Significance

Ten-dollar notes were among the most commonly issued denominations by the Confederate government during the Civil War. By the later years of the conflict, improved printing methods and design elements were introduced, even as inflation continued to erode the currency's purchasing power.

An excellent-condition Confederate ten-dollar note is a rare survival. Its preservation provides valuable insight into Confederate printing techniques, iconography, and the intended appearance of wartime currency before widespread economic collapse rendered such notes virtually worthless.
