Within Me Therapy provides individualized, in-home ABA therapy to help early learners diagnosed with autism reach their full potential.

The mission focuses on building communication, social, and adaptive skills while reducing maladaptive behaviors through evidence-based practices.

How Psychology Was Practiced

I secured my internship at NeuroSpring through professional connections on LinkedIn. The organization's innovative work in neuroscience and AI aligned well with both my academic background and future career interests.

NeuroSpring is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to advancing neuroscientific research and training that drives improved healthcare for underserved populations. The organization develops medical technologies for diagnosing and treating major neurological conditions and offers training opportunities to foster the next generation of scientists and engineers.

Psychology was applied throughout this internship in several ways:

- Human-centered Al Design: My work helped ensure the Virtual Neurologist could interpret natural human language, aligning with psychological principles of perception and cognition.
- Behavioral Analysis: I learned how people describe neurological symptoms, gaining insight into health behavior, communication barriers, and cognitive bias in self-reporting.
- Mental Models: Understanding how patients conceptualize their symptoms allowed me to assist in bridging gaps between human expression and Al interpretation.



Progress Toward Internship Learning Development Plan

- Professional Development: I gained firsthand experience in applying machine learning principles (MLPs) to healthcare diagnostics, a vital skill for future roles in health psychology or tech-integrated healthcare.
- Personal Development: I learned to navigate a highly technical environment outside my comfort zone, identifying both strengths and areas of growth in unfamiliar territory.
- Knowledge Goal: I deepened my understanding of Al's role in medical diagnostics and the relationship between cognitive science and artificial intelligence.
- Skills Goal: I honed skills in Al logic, research analysis, teamwork, and time management.
- Attitude/Value Goal: I developed greater resilience and adaptability by treating setbacks as opportunities for learning and growth.

Projects and Tasks Performed

During my internship, I contributed primarily to the Artificial Intelligence Diagnostic Project, specifically focusing on improving the Virtual Neurologist system. Key tasks included:

- Creating synonym exceptions to help Al interpret patient-described symptoms more accurately.
 Analyzing transcript data to optimize symptom recognition and diagnostic accuracy.
- Participating in weekly team meetings to present progress and receive feedback.
- Conducting independent research to improve Al-human interaction design in medical contexts.

Throughout this internship, I had the opportunity to designed and lead the "Own Your Pleasure" seminar, a virtual educational event for young adults on sex and self-empowerment. Ialso created clinician spotlight features for the organization's social media to increase community engagement. ABA Solutions LLC, Silver Spring, MD

Semester

Background

I found this internship when searching for Registered Behavior Technician jobs on Indeed. I was working at the time with another ABA company and decided to find something more local to College Park so I could continue the job throughout the semester. ABA Solutions' mission is to "provide excellent person-centered services that are evidence-based and rooted in the technologies of Applied Behavior Analysis" (ABA Solutions LLC).

Tasks Performed + Psychology Application

Being trained as a Registered Behavior Technician, my job entails carrying out techniques used in Applied Behavior Analysis. These techniques include but are not limited to discrete trial training, forward and backward prompting, naturalistic teaching, and manding for verbage. Typically, children with autism are nonverbal to some extent, so I work on helping them gradually build their speaking skills so they can thrive in social situations. In this internship, I primarily applied content from my Developmental Psychology courses that I have taken. In this class we discussed the importance of environment in a child's upbringing. I made sure to create a safe learning environment for my client and understand any triggers that could cause her stress such as loud noises. I also applied data analysis and collecting techniques from my PSYC300 course. Accurate data collection and analysis was vital to tracking my client's progress.



Learning Development Plan Progress

A knowledge goal that I had in the beginning of the semester was to "learn more about autism spectrum disorder and how it truly affectes the child academically and socially". I spent a lot of time this semester having conversations with my supervisor and the parents of my client to get a bigger picture of the child's life. I learned about her struggles in school and things I could do to support her growth in that context. A professional development goal I had was to learn the ins and outs of ABA therapy. After my mid semester evaluation, my supervisor said I could improve with seeking clinical guidance more. After that, when I was unclear about something or could just use more support in general I would ask

her when she supervised. For example, I was unclear with what would count as a correct answer for a discrete trial, and when I asked my supervisor fully explained it. I feel that my ABA skills are more thorough now and I also have more confidence going into each session.

Skills Learned and Moving Forward

The biggest skill I learned with this internship is the power of mindset. The mindset you go into a session with truly affects the way you interact with your client, your motivation to complete all the tasks, the irritation you will have during behavioral struggles, and the overall experience of the day. Not everyday I have to walk in super bubbly, but I at least need to demonstrate confidence and put my best foot forward. At the end of the day, this is entirely for the client and her progress should be taken very seriously. I will be continuing to work with this client after I graduate in December and resume to everyday hours. I also have contacted ABA Solutions to see if I could add another client. For now, I would like to focus on being an RBT and take in as much as possible. My long term goal is to be a School Psychologist, and I have met with multiple SP"s who have told me that my

multiple SP"s who have told me that my current job is great experience. I want to continue acquiring clinical hours and experience so that when I apply to graduate school in the next few years I feel confident moving forward.

I also planned an activity for the ready for advocacy meeting, which is a program designed to encourage self advocacy in the workplace for transitioning youth. I created a worksheet called, "conversation ping pong," which practiced a productive conversational method. In the meetings for Ready@21, I was assigned students to observe and I would write reports for the DOR (Division of Rehabilitation), as this is important for the programs funding.





Finding the Maryland Psychiatric Research Center

Last semester, I was doing pre-clinical addiction research on rodents. I was looking to switch to a human addiction research and found the Maryland Psychiatric Research Center (MPRC) in Catonsville, MD. I found their Treatment Research Program to be of particular interest, specifically the Baltimore Addiction Research Lab, as it is a perfect intersection of psychology, neuroscience, addiction, and pharmacology. I reached out to the Principal Investigator, Dr. Daniel Roche, and secured a spot working in the lab as an undergraduate research assistant.





Maryland Psychiatric Research Center's Mission

My internship site aims to provide treatment to patients with substance use disorders, educating professionals and consumers about the disorders, and conducting basic and translational research into the manifestations, causes, and treatment of these disorders. The Treatment Research Program incorporates a diverse range of treatment relevant research and provides numerous opportunities including clinical trials of new medications and strategies to help move people with alcohol use disorder on the path to recovery.

Projects and Tasks

My central task as a research assistant was to help the lab's primary and ongoing clinical drug trial. The study investigates the effects of the antibiotic, minocycline, on neuroinflammation and the gut microbiome in individuals with alcohol use disorder and healthy controls. As a research assistant, I helped conduct weekly visits with participants and collected a variety of samples from them. I assisted the primary research assistants and graduate student with conducting phone screens for eligibility, organizing samples, and inputting data into an online database called REDCap. These projects and tasks have contributed to me meeting my professional and personal development goals as well as my knowledge, skills, and attitude/value goals.

Application to Psychology

Through this internship, I have been able to apply a lot of knowledge I have learned through my major to the tasks I performed. I learned about the psychology behind the assessments and treatments of addiction and addictive behaviors, specifically alcohol use disorder. I learned applied knowledge about the relationship between trauma and alcohol, was able to shadow a Structured Clinical Interview for the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual for Mental Disorders, and researched mechanisms underlying addiction. I examined biases and stereotypes I had about people with alcohol use disorder and was able to overcome these implicit biases.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

Some skills and abilities I have developed during my internship include participant recruitment and screening, processing, organizing, and storing blood samples for trial, administering questionnaires and measurements for participant weekly visits during trial, collecting participant vitals, and participating in journal club presentations. I have learned time-management, how to appropriately interact with study participants in person and on the phone, self-motivation, and collaboration. I have gained more knowledge on the complexities and difficulties behind running a study, the assessments, measures, and samples that will be used for data analyses, and their significance to the overall study.



Impact of My Internship at MPRC

This internship experience has been extremely valuable for me as it pertains to my future interests in grad school and future career path. I intend to pursue a PhD in neuroscience in the future and this internship has given me a taste of what research in this field is like. I intend to continue my career in the development of pharmacological treatment and knowledge in the field of clinical addiction research. The hands-on clinical research experience, interpersonal communication skills, and work ethic I have gained from my time here will greatly benefit me in graduate school and beyond.

I was able to develop many skills during my internship at SJCP. By working remotely, I developed my time management and task prioritization skills. I learned to work efficiently while putting my best work forward and problem-solve when unique issues arose. I also learned how to use a management software I was unfamiliar with. Finally, I learned to conduct myself professionally and engage collaboratively to complete tasks involving multiple people.

This internship has impacted my future career goals. Before finding this internship, I did not know about faith-based counseling. I see that there is such a need for it, and now, I am looking into attending graduate school for clinical mental health counseling.



The MPRC is dedicated to providing psychiatric care, treatment, and research of the highest quality. The goal of my study titled REWARD6 is to be able to characterize specific impairments in different aspects of reinforcement processing, and their relationships to the psychopathology of schizophrenia.



Throughout this experience, I have been held responsible for consenting and screening study participants, collecting and analyzing biological samples, organizing all administrative data and more. I am also currently co-authoring a scientific paper on the results of our study which will be published sometime in the near future. The pictures I have provided all feature me and my coworkers during my first poster presentation.

In terms of my learning development plan, I have either reached or made significant progress in reaching every single goal I listed. I am in the process of co-authoring a paper, I have become adept at answering phone calls, I have learned a lot about the process of MRI imaging from our resident MRI tech, I have shadowed and practiced numerous clinical interviews, and I have developed fantastic relationships with my coworkers and boss Dr. Waltz.



I have also developed skills during my time at the MPRC which I did not anticipate and yet are crucial to the field of psychiatric research. I am now fully certified in using RStudio statistical programming software which is regularly used by top scientific researchers to perform cutting edge data analysis. Essentially, every single thing I have done here has been highly related to psychology.

I have gained a ton of valuable experience and developed essential skills at the MPRC which I will definitely be utilizing for the rest of my career journey going forward. The wide range of tasks I have been given from writing papers, giving scientific presentations, learning RStudio, interacting with patients with schizophrenia, and just generally learning the intricate workings of a psychology lab are experiences that I will carry with me forever. I am endlessly grateful to my coworkers and mentors who have offered me such an incredible opportunity and guided me the whole way through.



As I finish out my last year of study at UMD, I am now looking towards the future and my prospects for graduate school. This internship has helped me to fully realize my passion for clinical psychology.

My new goal is to ultimately become a knowledgeable, professional, and wholly compassionate psychiatric healthcare expert.

Playtime Project

I found my internship with Playtime Project through a friend who was taking a Human Development course and received an email sent to all students in the course alerting them to the opportunity.



Playtime Project's mission is to foster resilience and social emotional learning in children experiencing family housing insecurity by providing them with play experiences and resources.

At my internship, I attend programming twice a week at two of the organization's partnering sites, engaging in play activities with children and assisting in facilitating communication with parents and the planning of events. Outside of program, I assist in the creation of 'Success Plans' to address the needs of children in need of additional emotional or behavioral support and attend staff meetings to discuss their progress and next steps to take.



I made progress towards all five of the goals outlined in my Learning Goal Development Plan:

- 1. Learn how social workers can support families experiencing homelessness
 - a. In addition to playing with children during Playtime, social workers in the organization collaborated with families to provide resources like clothing, diapers, and wheelchairs, in addition to referral to services such as substance abuse treatment for parents. I learned that social workers can best serve families by providing holistic support and addressing multiple dimensions of needs.
- Become more attuned to and engaged with my neighbors/people in my community; earn the trust of families at my internship sites
 - a. I gained a more intimate understanding of the experiences of people in my community who are housing-insecure and how their experiences differ from my own despite living in the same area; my privilege affords me a more positive experience of College Park than some of the families attending Playtime.
 - Since starting, parents have become increasingly comfortable leaving their children with us and becoming less hypervigilant about watching over their children during program.
- 3. Understand the mechanisms of how informal play can promote resilience
- a. Informal play fosters imagination and gives children an opportunity to play out interpersonal communication in a fun, low-stakes environment.
- 4. Learn how to come up with interventions for children with behavioral challenges
- By creating very specific target outcomes with means to measure progress, all of the children who had Success Plans during my internship made at least some progress towards their goals.
- 5. Become more patient during frustrating or overwhelming situations
 - I frequently practiced empathy with the children at my internship and learned to be patient by considering their context and the factors outside of their control influencing their behavior.

Fall 2023

Psychology was practiced in my internship through the creation of Success Plans and SEL curriculum, which aimed to improve psychological outcomes for the children both short and long term.

Through my internship, I developed an understanding of the specific needs of children/families experiencing housing insecurity and how they differ from the needs of families who are not housing insecure. I became better at engaging meaningfully with children, mediating conflicts, and communicating with parents.



My internship helped me realize that I want to work with housing insecure populations in my future career; it also helped me clarify that pursuing a Masters of Social Work Degree is the best next step towards achieving my career goals.

Finding My Internship: As I usually do, this past summer I waited until the last minute to find a job or internship. In June, I got an email from the English Undergraduate Dept. with a job advertisement for the Latin American Montessori Bilingual Public Charter School. I replied and quickly set up an interview. My boss, the interviewer, was kind and offered me a job. However, it was for the fall, not summer. Still, I

took it and was able to get credit as well.



LAMB PCS's Mission: LAMB PCS's aim is to create a learning space tailored for students with a Latin background. However, LAMB PCS caters to all students in the area, providing them with a Montessori-style education with an emphasis on exploration and individual discovery.

Job Description: Generally, I was an assistant to after-care teachers. My job was to help teachers get the students' attention, explain activities, and be there for students if they needed help. I also took a larger role in programs such as soccer and guitar. I would collect the students from their classrooms and bring them to the activity, help maintain focus during the activity, and then bring them back to their classrooms.



Learning-Development Plan Progress: I had five goals for this semester: I wanted to learn to (1) interact with children. (2) assert myself, (3) gain attention from others, (4) learn my worth (not be taken advantage by others), and (5) work well in a group. I did a good job learning to interact with children. I learned that you just have to ask them guestions and they'll respond. I did okay asserting myself. I learned that you do not always have to be the "nice" quy, but, still, it is hard for me to not always strive to make everyone happy. I still have a lot of work to do to get people's attention. I don't have a particularly loud voice and to get everyone on task requires a level of engagement that I need to practice. I'm definitely finding my own self-worth. I have learned not to let people walk all over me, for example, saying "no" when children ask permission for something they shouldn't be doing. Still, it is hard for a people-pleaser like me to say "no." Finally, I was successful in group work. Maybe too successful, as my people-pleasing attitude made it easy to work well with others

Practice of Psychology: Psychology includes anything related to the inner-workings of the brain all the way to the way in which we interact with others. LAMB PCS included all of this. It required me to problem solve. For example, if I was picking up students for soccer, I had to figure out the best way in which to transport 30 students outside. Also, it required my to interact with students and fellow coworkers. I asked questions of students related to their favorite icecream or what they did for Halloween. Further, some of my coworkers only speak Spanish, a language I don't speak, so I also had to learn some common phrases.



Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities: I gained knowledge and several skills and abilities from my internship. For one, I now know the intricate organization required to run a classroom. Everything from the placement of the desk to pick-up at the end of the day must be worked out prior. Activities must be planned months in advance for them to happen and, in case of cancellations, backup ones must be planned too. Further, I gained several skills and abilities as well. I can better direct a classroom on my own. Although I am not perfect, I can also get students' attention, explain an activity, and help them if they have questions. Also, my organizational abilities improved as I was required to collect students from several classroom and bring them to different places, all at once. At first, it was a mess. I brought students to the wrong places at the wrong times. Soon, though, I was able to figure out what worked for me and came up with a system that got everyone where they needed to go.



Impact On My Future: I now know that teaching is a profession that I am good at. However, I don't know if I want to pursue teaching at a lower-level. I definitely enjoy teaching, but I would enjoy it at a higher-level with students I can interact with like adults. I would like to teach higher-level concepts at a college-level. This is based on my interactions with students at different ages. The older the students were, the more I enjoyed teaching them and the more I could converse with

Mission

My organization's mission is to provide effective, compassionate, and comprehensive therapeutic interventions to support individuals and their families. In association with the private practice, my supervisor oversees a social-emotional learning (SEL) program whose mission is to cultivate compassionate and aware minds in students, schools, families, and communities.



Practice

Psychology is practiced in my internship through therapy, the clinical and counseling psychologists use their education to help their patients. Additionally, the SEL curriculum is based on psychological theories, interventions and research to help the well-being of children.

Task

My tasks require me to attend live therapy sessions via zoom and code using the Clinical Directed Interaction (CDI) coding sheet during family therapy. I was fascinated with the organization's mission which included being bearers of HOPE to clients., empowering people living with mental health and co-occurring substance use disorders to work towards their treatment, education. community collaboration, and advocacy. I was able to incorporate and experience majority of content I have learned throughout my classes in psychology. Especially including adult psychopathology, multicultural psychology, addictive behaviors, clinical judgement, as well as getting real practice of counseling theories (specifically the humanistic approach to counseling).





Throughout the hours I worked, I developed my own caseload of 6 clients who I created treatment plans with, communicated with their providers, assisted in managing appointments, medication monitoring, counseling in daily life skills, and building rapport with my clients. I attended staff meetings to collaborate with staff members on next steps for clients and to discuss how we can better provide support. I have grown in all my learning development goals. I have completed legal/financial documents with clients, I have learned and experienced diverse life backgrounds, developed my understanding of the social work field, and have seen my strength in clinical judgment when counseling my clients. I still have room to grow in all these fields, but I have developed them immensely this semester.

Spring Semester 2023

I have developed skills throughout the semester in clinical judgement, counseling, activities of daily living, understanding work boundaries, documentation quality, when to ask for help. building rapport, professionalism, building confidence, and overall empathy. I got to develop skills from trainings in the stages of change. CPR, crisis intervention and de-escalation. entitlements, psychopathology, and many more. 

I found this internship, as a Recruiter for AACI Student Connect, through a friend of mine who works there. We both attended a program this past summer and she forwarded this opportunity to the programs group chat. I jumped at the opportunity, and have been working with AACI Student Connect to complete their mission of connecting Jews in Israel with others from around the world ever since. The hope is that each participant comes out of their cohort having explored their Jewish identity, connected with Israel, as well as making a personal and professional connection with their partner.

AACI Student Connect in partnership with JAFI pairs Jewish university students from Israel and the diaspora to bridge the large disconnect. The program allows participants to explore their Jewish identity, creates real human connections between Jews in Israel and in the Diaspora and provides the resources for the participants to continue their Jewish journey.

This program connects students from Israel and around the world, for 1:1 online conversations. Dialogue prompts facilitate the discussion, as you explore Jewish identity, the challenge of antisemitism and your own connection to Israel and your community.




I found my internship after attending the Everything I/O Psychology Networking Event on Wednesday, October 19, 2022.



The Department of Justice has five primary missions: (1) To enforce the law and defend the interests of the United States according to the law (2) To ensure public safety against threats foreign and domestic (3) To provide federal leadership in preventing and controlling crime (4) To seek just punishment for those guilty of unlawful behavior (5) To ensure fair and impartial administration of justice for all Americans. The Human Rights and Special Prosecutions Section largely helps prosecute major human rights crimes such as genocide, torture, and war crimes.

My main tasks were conducting research, analyzing and organizing materials, and summarizing and cataloguing documents relating to the human rights violations the rest of the team is working on. These tasks helped me fulfill the professional, personal, knowledge, skills, and attitude goals from my learning plan by building on my research skills, teaching me international human rights crimes, and giving me opportunities to connect with colleagues.



Psychology is beneficial to me in every relationship since an understanding of human behavior aids my personal interactions and decision making. 
Progress via Learning Development Plan

How Psychology Was Practiced

A huge topic in psychology is operant conditioning. I have learned this in most of my psychology classes since it is so relevant. In psychology, we learn that behavior is predictable. Operant conditioning shows that. Since ABA therapy is based on operant conditioning, this part of psychology was definitely practiced a lot in my internship. In operant conditioning, there is an antecedent (an event that happens before a behavior, which may actually predict a certain behavior), the behavior, and then a consequence. In a sense, all behaviors follow this formula. This can happen naturally in life: for example, if a loud sound goes off (antecedent), a child might cry (behavior), and his mom may comfort him (consequence). In ABA therapy, we teach using this method. The antecedent would be me, the behavior technician, asking an autistic child to complete a task. If the child does the task correctly (behavior), I will reinforce that behavior by giving the child his toy (consequence). This way the child learns to associate wanted behavior with something he enjoys so he can start to do the behavior unprompted. Reinforcement is HUGE in operant conditioning, as well as in

Progress Toward Goals

I have definitely made a lot of progress toward my Learning Development Plan. In my plan, I stated that a professional development goal of mine was to learn how to utilize ABA therapy correctly. Since this is basically the basis of the job, I have reached this goal. Like my advisors always say, we are constantly learning in this job. We never stop learning. However, I have gotten the basis of ABA therapy down. I said that I would know if I accomplished this goal if I can do ABA therapy without supervision and I have done this. Therefore, I would consider this goal accomplished, yet I still have a lot to learn. My knowledge goal was to learn more about Autism Spectrum Disorder, I believe I have made progress toward this goal since I do know way more about this disorder than before I started. First-hand experience working with individuals with ASD has helped me learn greatly. Lastly, I had the goal to become more patient. I do not think I have made too much progress toward this goal since this one takes some time. Being patient is a personal characteristic and to change that about myself, I need to work hard for it. I still feel frustrated in difficult situations, but I think it has gotten a little easier the more I work with kids.

Projects/ Tasks

- ABA therapy was the main task I performed. This is a very powerful treatment plan based on operant conditioning.
- o Data collection/taking each session
- Writing up reports on daily session
- Coming up with individualized reinforcers (most important part of ABA therapy)- etc. games, bubbles
- o Building bonds with clients

I eventually want to go to graduate school and I think this position has helped me develop skills that graduate programs may look for in students. Having this internship under my belt will help me stand out when applying for graduate school. I also have thought that I may want to work with children in my future career and this job has confirmed this for me. I love working with kids and really see this as something in my future career. I can also move up more in CSAAC which will help me develop more skills for my future career. I may even be able to make a career in the company if I decide to stay.


What did I do?

Finding CEI

I began my journey with CEI in March of 2019 as a volunteer. I knew I wanted to join the CEI team when I first learned of the plans to create a community center at Freetown Farm (now the current home of CEI) that provided access to healthy food, mental health services, and opportunities for environmental activism. I volunteered at the farm every week until early 2020, when I started my position as an intern coordinating volunteer groups. How I found it: Initially, I heard about START my freshman year through my friend participated in UMD's FIRE Program with START. I then heard about START the second time when I participated in the Global Fellows in Washington, DC program.

What is it? START is a research and education center dedicated to studying the causes and consequences of terrorism in the US and around the world. They use the best available open-source data, and are committed to the dissemination of their research findings



NATIONAL CONSORTIUM FOR THE STUDY OF TERRORISM AND RESPONSES TO TERRORISM

What I did: I collected information through open-source research and coded for 20+ variables for inclusion in the Social Network of American Radicals (SoNAR) dataset. I also completed a final statistical examining the relationship between military service and extremism.

Psychology at The Site: START constantly investigates and applies psychological, sociological, and criminological theories to patterns of radicalization. They use these theories to understand how we can better understand terrorist behavior.



Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities
Developed: Throughout my time at this
internship, I learned the in's and outs of
qualitative and quantitative analysis,
including the R coding language,
Microsoft Excel, and open-source
research skills. I also know have a much
deeper knowledge and understanding of
terrorism and extremism.

Internship Learning Development Plan Progress: I believe I was able to fulfill most of my goals outlined on the Internship Learning Development Plan. One, in particular, was my goal to network and build connections with my supervisors. I planned more one-on-one meetings with them to discuss graduate schools which developed my confidence and led me to reach out to others for advice.



How it Has Impacted Me: This internship has greatly impacted my plans for the future. Firstly, I was offered a paying job with START for the summer after my graduation. Second, I plan to attend graduate school for either forensic psychology, with a concentration in intelligence, or security studies.

As my interest in I/O psychology grew, I wanted to experience the kind of work that I/O psychologists might be involved in. ESURGI's Mission

Esurgi's main mission is to improve lives of others with the use of knowledge. Specifically, Esurgi does this by using biotechnology to provide medical devices to healthcare providers, physicians, and scientific researches.

Projects and Tasks Performed

During my internship, I had the opportunity to establish a project called bias in hiring. This project was composed of psychological biases that could happen during the hiring process as well as the legislation components related to unequal hiring. This bias project will be utilized for training purposes for future interns. Other than the project, my main tasks were to perform job analysis, screen resumes, and conduct interviews.



Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

Main knowledge I developed is the step by step procedures that are taken to hire a suitable candidate starting from job analysis to onboarding. A skill I developed is active listening during phone interviews in which I had to catch important information from candidates and record it. Finally, an ability that was required for me to perform given tasks was deductive reasoning; I had to come up with a logical reason why a certain candidate should be selected.

Psychology into Practice

I was able to apply what I've learned from my I/O psychology course. First is the job analysis. When conducting the job analysis, I had to formulate the knowledge, skills, and abilities required in order to write out the job descriptions. In addition, social psychology was applied when I created the bias in hiring project as this project contained psychological biases such as the halo effect that could happen during selection.



Impact and Next Stage

By experiencing what it's like to be involved in the full cycle of selection process, I was able to experience first hand what it's like to work in a HR department. In my learning development plan, I wished to be involved in personnel selections which I was able to accomplish throughout this internship. Because I enjoyed working with the Talent Acquisition team and interacting with candidates, I believe that I will be involved in an HR position upon graduation.

Through speaking about our career intentions and goals, she found out that, similar to herself, I was also interested in the Human Resources/Talent Acquisition field of business. Soon enough, she connected me with my soon-to-be supervisor, Kenny Yque. I was able to set up an interview with a few people on the team and then got hired 3 weeks later!



McCann's Mission

Projects & Tasks

The central task that I was assigned during my internship was to source and recruit candidates to join various departments within the agency. I was mostly working in LinkedIn Recruiter to get in contact with these people. Some of the departments that I recruited for were in Account Management, Design, and Technology Security. To go along with sourcing candidates, I was responsible for reaching out to them, coordinating interviews for them, and in some cases, conducting the interviews. Other tasks that I was assigned were research projects such as making extensive spreadsheets of McCann's top competitors in Utah. I also completed many reference checks for new hires. Lastly, I was also a part of the internship program planning process (creating new ideas to rejuvenate the program from previous summers).



Application of Psychology

Whilst being a Talent Scout, I definitely utilized social psychology skills. Specifically, being cognizant of my own stereotypes and biases when recruiting candidates was extremely important. I made sure that I was not falsely giving or denying somebody of an opportunity because of personal judgements. Secondly, I used my knowledge of different personalities and temperaments to help decide if that candidate would be successful in the available job (personality-job fit). It was my responsibility to decipher if they would be a good fit in the company, and further, in the department with the rest of the team.

Knowledge, Skills, Abilities

Throughout my time being the Talent Scout at McCann Worldgroup, I learned a lot. Firstly, I gained all of my knowledge about the Marketing and Advertising industry throughout the semester. I entered the internship with no prior advertising experience. Considering my internship was remote, my communication skills strongly improved while I was constantly communicating with various people via email and via telephone. Some abilities that I have acquired include the ability to source the correct candidates for different jobs, coordinating interviews with multiple different people, and conducting interviews for entry level positions.



Internship Impact

This internship has strongly impacted my future career goals. I plan on being a Human Resource Manager at some point in my career, and talent acquisition is a large sector of Human Resources. Recruiting candidates has helped me learn about the intricacies of different jobs, how to recruit people, and how to determine if an individual is the right choice for the open position. Additionally, prior to Covid-19, I was supposed to get a full-time offer directly following the end of the internship. Because this is not possible anymore, I am fortunate enough to be able to use my connections at McCann as references for future job offerings.



UMD Office of Community Engagement/AERE

For the Spring 2021 semester, I started out as an Assistant Project Coordinator intern with the UMD Office of Community Engagement. My work was focused on three primary areas; supporting the planning efforts of UMDs annual Good Neighbor Day, researching information on community engagement efforts by student orgs and academic departments, and representing the University at various

community and student tabling events.



Unfortunately, the event was canceled last-minute due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

My work to support Good Neighbor Day involved administrative and logistical planning in order to develop outreach efforts for volunteers, plan volunteer site logistics, and plan for contingencies. Alongside this project. I collected information on how different student orgs were interreacting with the community atlarge, as well as academic department programs. This research was for the annual Campus Connections Publication. I also was a representative of the UMD OCE at various community outreach and student fair events. During these events, I recruited student and community volunteers, got newsletter sign-ups, and promoted the efforts of OCE. My internship was put on pause after Good Neighbor Day was canceled. Fortunately, as my internship with UMD OCE was paused, I was given the opportunity to intern virtually as a Research Associate for AERE (Assessment, Education, and Research Experts).



Spring 2020

My internship with AERE is ongoing, but so far I have worked on three primary project. I researched and developed a professional documents on considerations for remote proctoring to support organizations switching to remote assessment in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. I also synthesized academic and professional sources into a literature review to support the development of a competency model for certification. The most recent work I have done for them is reviewing survey response data and marking significance and post hoc analysis for later review.





Kennedy Krieger Institute Child and Family Clinic

How I Found It: While looking for a chance to gain experience during my last semester of college, I worked with UMD staff to find the psychology department's Undergraduate Internship Sites Directory.

What Is It? Kennedy Krieger Institute is an institute dedicated to the health of its patients. The Child and Family Clinic provides evidence-based treatments to children and adolescents, with their family, who exhibit a variety of emotional and behavioral problems.



Kennedy Krieger Institute

What I Did: My tasks included observing therapy sessions via remote viewing. I also helped the staff score and analyze data such as MASC, CDI, and BASC. Along with helping the staff create usable tools for therapy sessions.

Psychology at The Site: The child and family clinic has trained cognitivebehavioral therapists to provide individual and family therapy. The therapists use cognitive-behavioral therapy to teach the clients behaviors that will improve quality of life such as problem-solving, prosocial behaviors, and proper coping skills.



Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities **Developed:** While completing my tasks. I was able to learn how to evaluate children and adolescent with the variety of emotional and behavioral problems using score sheets to analyze the data. I also learned the process of cognitive-behavioral therapy for a variety of ages as clients.

Spring 2020

How It Has Impacted Me: The internship was a great experience that I had the opportunity to learn from. I have gained enough knowledge of cognitivebehavioral therapy in a real-world clinical setting. I now understand that I would like to continue this type of career path. Watching the therapy sessions was not only enlightening but also interesting and I became invested in the lives of the clients. I know now that I would enjoy working with children in a mental health setting.

DC VA Medical Center

The Washington DC VA Medical Center provides many different kinds of healthcare to veterans. There are similar hospitals around the country that are run by the Veterans Health Administration (VHA), which is a component of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.



I wanted to work for this organization because I belive that providing strong mental health services to veterans is a noble mission. I found out about this internship through a posting on the UMD Psychology blog.



My internship was in mental health services. More specifically, I was a research assistant in a lab conducting research on PTSD treatment. The main goals in this lab were to

- 1) Examine existing research and summarize this in a literature review.
- Conduct analyses of the effectiveness or ineffectiveness of the services that this hospital provides.
- Apply this research in developing more effective practices.

My work included completing ethics training prior to beginning my role, reading through existing research and summarizing key findings through data extraction, organizing data in Excel, and discussing the efforts of this lab with other members of the lab.



This internship has influenced my career goals by teaching me that research can and should be practiced in many different contexts, and can inform lots of different decisions, including treatment practices, public policy, and education practices. I hope that I can ultimately obtain a PhD and conduct important reserach that can inform criminal justice related policy decisions.

- · Counseling Psychology:
 - o Therapeutic relationship between therapist and client
 - Various types of theoretical orientations being used in the treatment process.

Knowledge, Skills, & Abilities Developed

From my internship, it has given me some insight and knowledge into how an outpatient mental health organization is operated daily from the logistical side. From an administrative standpoint, I have learned how to use an electronic behavioral health record system to perform various tasks. Finally, I have acquired the ability to handle sensitive information and maintain confidentiality of client information, and fine-tuned my administrative skills.



Next Steps

I am taking a gap year to gain more experience in the field of psychology, ideally in work and research experience. I plan to obtain a graduate certificate in Applied Thanatology to serve as a post-baccalaureate program. I also plan to obtain a Master's and Doctorate in Counseling Psychology. Mission Statement



Tasks & Application of Psych



This position allowed me to directly apply my knowledge of Autism, a disorder that had piqued my interest in my Biological Basis of Behavior class. The treatments used at Little Leaves are based in ABA, a practice that has been studied for decades and has shown impressive results for children with ASD. Through this position, I was able to observe many different cases and presentations of ASD and use various ABA techniques to assist in their personal development.

Skills Developed

Through working with Little Leaves, I gained valuable experience and knowledge. I learned the importance of patience in working with my clients, and of communication in working with my supervisor and the families of my clients. These are skills I will be able to apply in almost any future professional setting.

As an organization, NPR is focused on delivering high-quality, fact-based information to benefit the public. They do this through government funding, but mainly through audience donations!

Data analysis was a key component of the tasks I carried out at NPR. One such project involved analyzing the performance of the notifications the NPR application sends to inform best practices in terms of time-of-day, verbiage, and even which topics perform better for notifications.



The constant stream of data we receive required me to obtain new skills to keep up. I began employing Search Query Language (SQL) to analyze Google Analytics data. Learning SQL on the job was both challenging and rewarding

I also gained the extremely important skill of presenting research! While I had done it before, my internship involved presenting almost weekly towards the end. Presenting information in a concise, clear fashion is invaluable.

However, getting to see Tiny Desk performances such as Harry Styles was my favorite NPR experience by far.



My time at NPR has convinced me that statistics and data analysis will continue to be a focal point of my career. As a result of this internship, I am now also seeking a quantitative or statistics specialization. I'll also be sticking around at NPR as a Data Analyst!

What is the mission of NCMEC? How did I find my internship?

The NCMEC mission is to help find missing children, reduce child sexual exploitation, and prevent child victimization. I found my internship through a colleague of my dad's whose wife works for NCMEC.



Who did I work for?

I worked for the Case Analysis Division (CAD) which conducts research to create statistics to inform the public and find trends in the cases they assist law enforcement with.



What did I work on?

I interned at NCMEC over two different semesters (Summer 2018 and Spring 2019) so I had the opportunity to work on a variety of projects. One of the first major projects that I worked on was a study looking at Non-family Infant Abductions (NFAs). I assisted in reviewing all relevant cases and coding them for any of the variables that we deemed relevant to the study. I then worked on a project looking at Boys in Child Sex Trafficking. Just as with the NFAs. I read case narratives and coded anything that met the qualifications of the variables we were interested in. In another project related to Child Sex Trafficking, I assisted with the coding for a project done for the Department of Justice. The goal of this project was to identify what the next online platform the DOJ should move to be taken down for its use by traffickers since Backpage was taken down last May.

How was psychology used during my internship?

Throughout my internship I used what I had learned about child and adult psychopathology when reading the case narratives. I also used my knowledge of attachment theory when reading most of the child sex trafficking cases. This intersection became very interesting to me and has prompted me to think more about how attachment interventions could benefit foster children, which were the majority of the subjects in our cases.



How did this internship impact my future?

Since I finished working at NCMEC I have begun to consider getting a masters in social work. The child sex trafficking cases really piqued my interest in the foster care system and how a social worker can change the life of a child.

At Harbor Light, individuals can learn to administer Structured Clinical Interviews for the DSM-5, a semi-structured interview guide for making the major DSM-5 diagnoses. Interns discover how psychological theories apply to real-world settings while developing a knowledge base surrounding the symptomology of various disorders as well as useful diagnostic criteria. Interns also strengthen their own clinical interview and professional writing skills in a professional context.

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This picture shows an example of a clinical note I wrote & presented, where I recommended treatment options to the client's counselor based on the client's presenting symptoms.

Since 1951, the Salvation Army Harbor Light Center has helped individuals battle substance abuse, homelessness, develop skills for managing grief and anger, and has provided an array of mental health services including individual and group therapy to dually-diagnosed populations of the D.C. metropolitan area. Given the Salvation Army's ties with the Evangelical Christian Church, the facility bases many of its morals on biblical teachings. Its mission is to preach the gospel and simultaneously meet human needs without discrimination.



This internship has impacted my academic and professional trajectory by giving me in-field experience with under-represented populations. It has taught me how to administer clinical interviews and collect EEG data, making me a competitive applicant for any post-bachelorette program, graduate program or any other future endeavor in the clinical neuroscience field.

I found this internship opportunity through UMD's Clinical and Cognitive Neuroscience Lab. Our lab collects EEG data at Harbor Light and interprets event related potentials (ERPs) that are typical measures for neuroscientific cognitive research, including theta and delta frequency bands associated with attentional control and task-based processing.

Mission Statement

This YMCA branch seeks to foster spiritual, mental, and physical development of individuals, families and the community. Funded by the Maryland Department of Health and Human Services, the RYS/CORE Counseling Branch works towards its mission by providing services such as individual counseling, family counseling, case management, and psychoeducational groups in Montgomery County Public Schools.





Projects & Tasks

My main task was to collaborate with other mental health professionals to create curricula for and lead psychoeducational groups. Some groups I helped run this semester included a self-esteem group and a high-school readiness group. In addition to leading these groups, intern tasks included organizing client files, conducting intakes for individual therapy sessions with the licensed mental health counselors, and organizing quarterly reports and audits.

Application of Psychology

At the RYS/CORE Counseling Branch, various counseling theoretical orientations were utilized by therapists and interns to plan activities for both individual and group therapy sessions. Additionally, the branch utilized ecological, multicultural, child development theories to both address client concerns as well as help clients develop coping skills that they can use on their own after the work at the branch is done.

Personal Development

While interning at the RYS/CORE Counseling Branch, my skills as a helper became much stronger through my direct interactions with clients. I also learned how to run a successful psychoeducational group for young adolescents. Additionally, my knowledge of how to adhere to ethical and professional standards was greatly strengthened throughout my various experiences at the YMCA.

Future Directions

While I knew I wanted to pursue a career as an LCSW before this internship, my experience at the YMCA has both strengthened this desire and helped me get to the crucial next step in my professional journey.  - This helped me to stay on top of everything I had to do and produce things that just about hit the mark the first time, every time.

Future Directions

Who I worked for and How I found it!

I completed my PSYC389 Internship with the Little Leaves Behavioral Services. Little Leaves Offices are located at The Auburn School Campuses in Silver Spring, Fairfax and Baltimore. I found this organization through searching on the Psyc-E-News Blog where there are many varying posts on work and research opportunities.



What is Little Leaves's mission?

Little Leaves is an organization that works with individuals who have social, communication, and behavioral challenges to help them grow so they can be a part of their family and community as much as possible. They use evidenced-based practices with their clients based upon the research and data of Applied Behavior Analysis.



What tasks did I perform?

I worked as a behavioral therapist with Little Leaves. I met with an individual client and worked with them through programs to improve some of their daily living skills. All of these programs were data driven and implemented with Applied Behavior Analysis techniques. For example, one type of program helps clients learn how to properly play games with others. In this program, the child would play games and learn to understand rules, wait for their turn, acknowledge when a game is complete or keep a game clean. These are various skills that we may learn naturally but are very important for those who have social challenges. A great deal of the work was other similar daily living skills taught through Applied Behavior analysis.

How was psychology practiced at Little Leaves?

Litle Leaves approaches every client based on Applied Behavior Analysis Principles. These principles are based upon research and data regarding the best ways to interact with clients. Many of the programs use Operant Conditioning models where children are reinforced for positive behavior.



How did this internship impact my future?

Litle Leaves opened me up to potentially working more with children in the future. I understand their mission to help each child with their different struggles. I felt that I could dedicate my career choice to working with children as a therapist or teacher and would both give and gain a great deal as I did from this experience.





CARD executes large-scale randomized controlled trials (RCT) to assess the effectiveness of early intervention programs on children with autism. Parents and teachers in the underserved Baltimore community are assessed pre- and post-training developed and offered by CARD.



Impact:

My experiences at CARD has impacted me in a multitude of ways. I have gained the clinical experience needed to determine a field of study in graduate school. Additionally, I made connections with employees who have been able to give me advice on how to pursue a career in early intervention research.

Involvement:

I heard about CARD through a graduate student I worked with. After browsing the website, I grew really interested in the research that Dr. Rebecca Landa was conducting. I reached out to her for opportunities and a research coordinator contacted me soon after!



CARD's Mission:

CARD utilizes evidence-based research, clinical service, and training programs to serve children with autism through empowerment, improvement of quality of life, and promotion of family well-being with an ultimate goal of unlocking children's potentials.

Tasks Performed:

During my time at CARD, I collaborated with employees to develop and pilot a coding scheme for parent-child interactions during book-reading. I also trained employees how to use the coding system, ELAN, and provided feedback for them to become reliable.



More Tasks Performed:

I engaged in stimulus creation and preparation for teacher training as part of a RTC. I also observed clinical psychologists administering standardized assessments and speech-language pathologists executing an early intervention program to preschoolers with autism.



taught me how important building rapport with clients was. Instead of being a stoic, cold counselor doing his job, I was pushed by other counselors and supervisors to become a physical and emotional ally to the clients.

While this internship revealed that I was meant to work with a younger age group, I will use the practices and skills that I have learned here to get my masters in counseling psychology and become a counseling psychologist for teens and young adults struggling with abuse, trauma and divorce.



Psychology Practices

At this internship opportunity, I had the ability to employ social and behavioral psychology techniques to manage a student's behavior or interactions with peers. For example:

- Finding appropriate way to express emotions of frustration, anger, annoyance, etc.
- Using occupational therapy instruments to relieve repetitive movements or utterances.
- Enforcing "full body" listening: listening with eyes directed at person speaking, mouth closed and waiting for person to finish speaking, and body calm.
- Practicing subtle social interactions such as not "policing" your peers, being mindful of personal space, and recognizing body language and facial cues.

My Next Stages

Interacting with young children truly brought joy to my day. However, I prefer interacting with them on a smaller, personal level (5 children or less). If I were to continue with child psychopathology in the future, it would most likely be in a research lab or in individual cognitive behavioral therapy. For my next internship experience, I am interested in working in the field of adult psychopathology.

This semester, I interned for an Occupational Therapist at HSC Outpatient Center in Lanham. The Outpatient Center was created in order to serve children with complex health needs from birth to age 21. I found this internship because I met the occupational therapist while taking my therapy dog to visit patients at HSC.



The room in this picture is called the Sensory Room:Th this is the room where I helped treat patients. I was responsible for setting up the materials in this room.

For each patient, I had to find different activities and toys to use based on the child's occupational goals.



Some of these activities, such as cutting putty, playing with Play-Doh, and putting coins in a toy piggy-bank, worked on improving the child's fine motor skills they need to do well in school. To teach patients how to do these activities, I often had to use the hand-over-hand method so they got used to the movements.

A big part of my job was helping to regulate m patient's emotions and keep them motivated. Since many of the children I worked with had autism and nonverbal, I needed to use my knowledge of psychology in order to recognize when the child started to get overwhelmed. When I noticed them becoming overwhelmed, I would use a gross motor activity or songs to calm them.



These internship hours will qualify me for Towson's Master's OT program.

My Job as an Intern

The responsibilities I held as an intern included assisting therapists in the creation and implementation of group therapy curricula. I was also responsible for contacting parents of children who had been referred and completing intake interviews.

For the spring semester, I was assigned three groups. I was given a group run by only interns on High School Readiness, I assisted a therapist on Impulse Control, and assisted another therapist on Emotions and Anxiety. I was the lead creator of curriculum for the High School Readiness group. Each week, I met with the therapists for the clinical groups and discussed how the upcoming group session will be run, and assisted in designing plans for future groups.

In completing intake interviews, I called a minimum 4 clients' parents per month and found out more about the presenting problem and the client's history.

Psychology in my Internship
The YMCA YFS taught me how to work with children
in a way that they learn to build on existing strengths
while teaching them new ways to cope with
challenges with mental health that they may face. In
assisting counselors in creating curricula for groups
that focus on mental health, I was able to use my
background in psychology in considering what
techniques might work best given the age of the
children and the severity of the presenting problem.

Before interning at the YMCA YFS, I had never considered a Licensed Clinical Social Worker as a possible career path. From talking to my supervisor, I was able to learn about different graduate school opportunities to obtain licensure as a LCSW. I was also able to learn different career options from obtaining a Master's degree rather than a PhD.





Internship Projects/Tasks

- Scored a variety of assessment measures used to assess the severity and type of behavior problems (shown above)
- Created addendums to be entered in patients' medical records
- Observed and participated in treatment sessions
- · Created intake packets
- Organized clinic materials such as toys, coloring sheets, and visual aids
- Attended weekly meetings with a supervisor to ask questions and discuss professional development

Application to Psychology

This internship was related to Psychology in a number of ways. First and foremost, the clinicians used evidence-based treatments such as PCIT and ABA therapy when working with clients. I was able to use the knowledge I learned in my abnormal psych classes to think critically and further my understanding of these treatment methods. Additionally, each of the clinicians had a Ph.D. or Psy.D. in clinical or school psychology; this allowed me to learn about the variety of degrees available in the field.



Future Impact

This internship has impacted my future by helping me discover the type of work I would and would not like to do as a future psychologist. I one day hope to attend a doctoral program in psychology, and this internship helped me decide what programs will be a good fit for me.






How I Found My Internship
