







## Does it pass the CRAAP test? **Research Question:** Why are school lunches important?

	Name of source:	<a href="#">National School Lunch Program</a>	<a href="#">USDA Shifts Obama-era School Lunch</a>	<a href="#">School Meal</a>
<b>Currency</b> 	When was the site created? - (often not listed) When was it last updated? Are the links up to date or are they expired? <b>Give evidence</b>			
<b>Relevancy</b> 	Can you understand the content? Is the content related to your research questions?	Does it help you understand the research question?		
 <b>Authority</b>	Look at the <b>ABOUT</b> page - Is the author clearly identified? Is the author well-respected or an expert? Is there contact information for the author? <i><b>(When in doubt, Google the author!)</b></i> <b>Give evidence</b>			
<b>Accuracy</b> 	Does the site have correct spelling and grammar? Are there references or links showing where the information came from? Are claims backed up in other sources? Is the domain typically reliable? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Government</b> sites: .gov or .gv</li> <li>• <b>Schools</b>: .edu (could be college or elementary...)</li> <li>• <b>Organizations</b>: .org (beware of bias!)</li> <li>• <b>Commercial</b> (business): .com</li> </ul> <b>Give evidence</b>			
<b>Purpose</b> 	Is the purpose of the website clear? Can you tell if the information is fact or opinion? Can you see <b>bias</b> in the information on the site? <b>Give evidence</b>			
	<b>OVERALL is this source credible?</b>
