



South End Neighborhood Council Meeting Minutes

April 3, 2023

1. Call to order & Chair's Welcome
 - a. Athena Brewer called to order the regular meeting of the South End Neighborhood Council at 7:08 PM on April 3, 2023, via Zoom.
 - b. Approval of the minutes from the last meeting & current agenda. Motion by Cheryl Kopec seconded by Tony Caldwell. The current agenda & previous meeting minutes have been approved.

2. Community Announcements/Comments/Concerns/Questions

 - b. Community member: David Thompson – Food is Free Director. April 22nd at Peace Lutheran Church selling flowers to raise money. 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Food giveaway every Thursday at Hope Point Church starting at 11 a.m. for approximately 2 hours. 6511 South D Street. Food Rescue on Tuesdays at 11am Hope Point Church 6511 S C St. Food rescue for tomorrow has been rescheduled to Thursday at 11am.
3. Liaisons Extraordinaire
 - a. Troy Green, Tacoma Fire Department. Remind everyone to move to the right and stop when you see sirens and lights. Providing a handout in the chat.
 - b. Allyson Griffith of Neighborhood & Community Services. Safe parking site at Holy Rosary is delayed. Target opening Monday. Cars, vans and trailers. No RVs. Maximum of 40 people. *Cheryl asked if that will impact the drop off site for Tacoma Rescue Mission.* Allyson will get back to Cheryl. 82nd & Pacific site is serving 90 individuals. 35th & Pacific is still full and has the longest waiting list. Code compliance has 162 open cases compared to 161 last month. Expect month over month cases will increase. Private property abatements at 8839 Pac Ave; 8866 and 8870 C Street; 8423 C Street. If you have private property and want to enroll

in the graffiti removal program, the City provides free removal. *Tony Caldwell commented regarding 72nd & Hosmer cleanup. City did an excellent job and it is appreciated. Also, the graffiti around the city is getting worse. Noticed that a lot of the writing is similar.* Allyson stated this was a WSDOT cleanup and she will forward the appreciation to them. Lieutenant Katz can speak to the graffiti issue. *Esther Day reported the park & rides having issues and asked for status.* Allyson stated that WSDOT called her and obtained more information.

- c. Lieutenant Jeffrey Katz Community Policing. Asked that if you see graffiti to report it to [Tacomasafe.org](https://www.cityoftacoma.org/UserFiles/Servers/Server_6/File/cms/Police/NewsReleases/March%2030%202023.pdf) and they prioritize graffiti that has any biased component to it. Is aware of the Park & Ride situation and are working on a plan. Held several coffee and conversation events. The next one is April 14th at the Starbucks at 38th and Fife. Working with Multicare on a gun buyback program https://www.cityoftacoma.org/UserFiles/Servers/Server_6/File/cms/Police/NewsReleases/March%2030%202023.pdf. Safe Place initiative (<https://tacomasafe.org/>) is designed for businesses to be a safe place for bias related crimes. TPD is hiring. Looking to hire 50 people. \$25,000 hiring bonus. *Esther thanked Lieutenant for working together with the homeless encampments.* Contact Lieutenant Katz if you have any events you would like him to attend. *Andrea thanked Lieutenant Katz for the event.*

5. New & Old Business

- a. Executive Team usually meets the Third Monday. Switch the Executive meeting to an all board meeting. This means all of the board will be informed.
- b. Squarespace – there are three months of square space cleaned out.
- c. Andrea needs to be added to the checking account.

6. New Board Member Vote - -Poll. Received application from Isaac Pennoyer. Andrea called for a vote to have Isaac join the board in seat #8. 15 votes and a majority approved Isaac as a Board member. Welcome Isaac to seat #8.

Rachel Wilkie shared that the tree planting event on 72nd & D was completed. 64 people turned out. The next phase is to obtain concrete bumpers to protect the trees and deter people from driving over the trees. Will retrain the neighborhood to parallel park beside it. Expect the murals to go in May once the contracts are completed with the City. Rachel & Andrea looked at the NW corner of 84th & Hosmer. Wrote a grant to obtain the funding, in the oldest map of Tacoma is where

Lakewood, Unincorporated Tacoma and Tacoma. Found it is owned by unincorporated Pierce County. They will do a survey to establish the ownership. Will move forward with a smaller area and the upper level. Will take a year or two to get the trees in place. Councilmember Ushka and Councilmember Bushnell were very helpful. Email a letter of support to the SENCO email.

Next meeting is Monday, May 1st at 7:00 p.m. via Zoom. Received inquiries for in person meetings, but still concerned with illness. Looking at hybrid meetings.
