- Review of 2022-2023 activities and accomplishments [11:35 11:45am]

    - WGH Course Ratings AY 2022-2023 (See Document)
      - Summary: The overall average course rating for WGH courses is 4.83 (with Spring II course WGH 207 pending an updated course rating). The newest course, WGH 230: The Health of Transgender and Gender Diverse People, received a course rating of 4.8. All of the courses performed well!
    - WGH Events for AY 2022-2023 (See Document)
      - Take Action Tuesday highlights
      - WGH hosted events and attendance
        - Summary: Attendance at events (both virtual and in-person) averaged around 30 people this year across 7 events. Events ranged from in-person guest speakers in the realm of gender and health, virtual speakers, and a trip to Schlesinger Library for the Age of Roe exhibit. The Fall and Winter Socials brought out 39 and 21 individuals, respectively.

# • Review of WGH 2022-2023 budget [11:45-11:55am]

- o WGH Budget Review 2022-2023 (See Document): to set fiscal basis for planning
  - Funds allocated, funds spent, funds remaining all amounts approved for proposed budget for 2023-2024
  - Changes for allocation amounts (including carryover)
    - The student staff rates have increased by 3% for each corresponding rate level (e.g., 2nd year rate is 23.02 and the 3rd year and above rate is 25.61). This has been reflected in the proposed budget allocation for 2023-2024.

# Brainstorming for WGH events for AY 2023-2024 [12:00-12:30pm]

- Event ideas are listed in the <u>WGH Event Schedule</u> (See Document which includes chronology of events planned and who is the lead for each event)
- Decided to set theme for AY 2023-2024 to be: "Advancing Health Justice Work in a Polarized World" – with a focus for Fall 2023 being "Navigating and Resisting Mis/Disinformation" and for Spring 2024 being "Intersectionality"
- Motivating this decision is:
  - the US and global rise in anti-LGBBTQIA+, anti-abortion, and other conservative assaults on sexual and reproductive rights and justice, along with their seeking to undermine public health regulatory authority and types of teaching & books permitted in public education and public libraries, and their implications for health care access and health equity
  - within HSPH, the controversies triggered in Spring 2023 by an HSPH faculty member having signed, as a public health professional, an anti-gay amicus brief in 2015 for the US Supreme Court case on gay marriage and in the past year publishing popular articles on abortion and gender identity (despite having published no scientific research on these issues) that contradict the expertise of WGH and other HSPH faculty and the scientific evidence on these matters
- For each semester we will have 3 events:
  - one a panel focused on the relevant issues as they are playing out in the US & the rest of the world
  - one focused internally in school on implications for pedagogy
  - one focused how to have conversations about these potentially polarizing topics with peers, colleagues, family members, and others
- All events will be in-person, and some will have an option to livestream (but will not be "hybrid," i.e., no expectation that those on-line can participate)
- We also will bring back the fall event we used to have (before COVID) to connect students to various groups who would be interested in having students work with them on projects (including internships & practica) that have a gender & health justice aspect:
  - this included various community groups in Boston, and we can work on making these links with FXB, who has agreed to participate
  - it also included bringing in a speaker to inform students about the "Nation Building" I & II courses offered in January & Spring semester by the Harvard University Native American Program (HUNAP), since the

Spring course includes working on projects requested by different tribal governments in the US (and sometimes in Canada and other countries), many of which have a public health focus, and several WGH students have worked on these projects (most recently, one involving two-spirit Indigenous youth in Canada, and another on mitigating health ramifications of climate change in Inuit villages in Alaska).
