Embedding Videos in Canvas


Uploading a Video to YouTube for Educational Purposes

Step 1: Go to **YouTube.com**. You may also find YouTube in the G-Suite App menu.

Step 2: Check to make sure you are logged in with your .cgc email address, by clicking on the **account menu**. If you need to sign in to your school email, remember it is

yourmeid@cgc.edu - that will take
you to the single sign on for
Maricopa.

Step 3: Click on Create a Video or Post button. Choose Upload a Video from drop down.



Step 4: Name your channel. Upload as... First Name Last Name By clicking "Create channel", you agree to YouTube's Terms of Service. 
right click on it and download your


Step 6: Add a Title, Description, etc. Click Publish when completed.

Step 7: Once the processing is complete, the link on the left under Upload status will take you to your video on its YouTube page. Click on the **link to your video**.



Step 11: Paste the code in the **embed** tool anywhere in Canvas that has a rich text editor box like this on the right.


NOTE: You have to click **Embed** on center tab to paste the code.



When you are done, you will have the video there in Canvas but not taking up any of your course space
