Formed out of individuals all well-established in Beirut's independent music scene, SANAM's debut album last year, Aykathani Malakon [Awoken by an Angel], combines experimental rock, spacious ambient and Arabic/Taraab music styles for a record as luscious and pretty as it is tense and ominous.
