Abstrak bukan "pengantar", atau kesimpulan dari diskusi tetapi terbatas pada: (1) pertanyaan utama dan latar belakang masalah yang dibahas; (2) posisi penelitian; (3) bagaimana pertanyaan itu dibahas (metode); dan (4) hasil utama diskusi/penelitian. The introduction should answer the questions: (1) why is your research so important to answer; and (2) how is your research related to previous research, mention the novelty of your research; (3) state the purpose of your research clearly and concisely, and how your research contributes to the development of further research.
