Fluffy Scrunchies

statement pieces aren't just for clothes! the oversized, frilly scrunchie has taken over and we're loving the color and playfulness they add to any fit. get mismatched with any leftover strips of fabric and trim that you have, and follow these simple steps to make a pile of your own accessories.

all measurements in the pattern are customizable. cut your fabric pieces longer to add more volume & frills or wider for a larger circumference. the elastic length listed will create a scrunchie that wraps around a ponytail once - just pop it over a hair tie. if you want to wrap your scrunchie around your hair multiple times, cut your elastic 8 in/20 cm long instead.

Scrunchie #1

materials:

1 piece of fabric: 40 in/100 cm by 5 in/13 cm

1 piece of trim: 40 in/100 cm long

1 piece of thin (~1/4" in) elastic: 5 in/13 cm long

instructions:

- 1. fold fabric piece in half (good sides together, short edges touching) and sew short edges together
- 2. press the seam open, then fold each long edge in on the wrong side (approximately 0.25 in/0.75 cm) and press in place
- 3. fold fabric in half (wrong sides together, long edges touching). place trim in between the two edges (outer edge of the trim facing out) and pin in place around the whole piece
- 4. sew along the outer edge of the fabric to secure trim in place, leaving a 1 in/2.5 cm opening at the end
- 5. attach the elastic to a safety pin and insert into the opening. feed the elastic through the entire length of the scrunchie, then sew the two ends together
- 6. tuck the elastic into the scrunchie and sew the opening closed to finish

Scrunchie #2

materials:

2 pieces of fabric: 24 in/61 cm by 3 in/7.5 cm serger thread OR bias tape 1 piece of thin (~1/4" in) elastic: 5 in/13 cm long

instructions:

- 1. place the fabric pieces good sides together and sew down one of the long edges
- 2. open the piece up and fold (wrong sides together, short edges touching) and sew short edges together using a french seam
- 3. serge or bind the two raw outer edges (video tutorial shows how to bind edges!)
- 4. fold piece in half at the long seam (wrong sides together) and pin or press in place. the seam should be in the center, with the serged/bound edges on the outer edge of the scrunchie
- 5. sew a line 0.5 in/1.25 cm away from the inner edge. sew around the whole piece, but leave a 1 in/2.5 cm opening at the end
- 6. attach the elastic to a safety pin and insert into the opening in between the two layers of fabric. feed the elastic through the entire length of the scrunchie, then sew the two ends together
- 7. tuck the elastic into the scrunchie and sew the opening closed to finish

Meet the material grrrl! Sam (they/them) of Say Less Textiles :)

say less textiles

How did you begin working with textiles?

I started around 14 when my grandma taught me how to knit! I picked back up around 24 years old when I finished graduate school. I felt like the life had been sucked out of me with graduate school. The only thing that made me feel better was to be around yarn. I never stopped after that. I have worked with almost all of the fiber arts, but I never stop going back to knitting.

You use such an interesting mix of images, patterns & text - what's your process for planning a composition, and where do you start?

It always starts with an obsession with something text-based. I base everything on that initial text. Before I move on with imagery, I choose a color palette and stick with that as much as possible to make the entire project cohesive. For example, with something like Pearl, there are so many ways you might leave feeling after watching. I was most impacted by the rage, sadness, and loneliness conveyed throughout the movie. I really wanted the imagery to convey that uneasiness. I typically knit up 2-3 prototypes before I get what I want, but it is so much fun seeing what will feel right.

What inspires your text choices?

I find communicating with people really difficult. I have a speech impediment, which really makes me self-aware. When I see/hear/read a text that resonates with me, it feels like I can finally communicate

my feelings. I'll find myself thinking about that particular text over- and over, and then I know that I have to knit it up.

Your color combinations are always so joyful and creative - do you have any advice for people trying to find their personal aesthetic?

For me, I am really curious about Japanese street fashion. Magazines, like Fruits, are a great inspiration for color combinations. If I am going to knit for 60+ hours, I have to love it! I always tell people to find their favorite color and choose a color opposite on the color wheel. You have to force yourself out of your usual choices. Another option is to take photos of things in the world and use them for yarn shopping.

What are you currently working on? What's something you're excited to make in the future?

Pearl and Franz Kafka's Metamorphosis are my main projects right now. I've been playing around with each of the panels for a few months now, but the direction is going great. I am taking a little break to make a Radiohead sweater, which should be really fun. I'm most excited to start playing around with different garment constructions for the spring/summer. As someone who is non-binary (& not straight sized) I am hoping to play around with more androgynous and creative fits for the warmer months, but with my colorwork additions!

Be My Baby Bonnet Crochet Pattern

the sweetest winter accessory in your stash! yarn is held double throughout the pattern, so it's thick and warm, makes up super quick, and leaves you with a bunch of color options - make it with two strands of the same color or choose two that contrast.

materials

6mm hook 2 skeins size 4 yarn

gauge

13 sts by 13 rows = 4x4 inches single crochet stitch, 6mm hook

technique

throughout the pattern, hold yarn double. this bonnet is crocheted from the top down. you will begin by creating a rectangle for the top of the head, then crochet around 3 sides of the rectangle to build the body of the bonnet. the last step is to add trim to each side and two chains to use as ribbons.

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Instructions

top

Hold yarn double for the entire pattern

Chain 12

Chain 1 and turn

Single crochet through the back loop only for 16 rows

Cut working yarn and fasten off

Turn your piece so your chain tail is in the bottom left hand corner and the tail you just fastened off is in the top right hand corner

body

Insert hook into the bottom right corner of the rectangle 16 single crochet along the right side of the rectangle (one in each row)

12 single crochet through the back loop only across top side of rectangle (one in each stitch)

16 single crochet along the left side of the rectangle (one in each row)

You should have 44 stitches on three sides of the rectangle Chain 1 and turn

Single crochet through the back loop only in each stitch for 22 rows (optional: add more rows here to make the bonnet longer)
Cut working yarn and fasten off

face border

Insert hook into the bottom left corner of the bonnet
23 single crochet along the left side of the face (one in each row)
12 single crochet along the top of the face (one in each ch)
23 single crochet along right side of the face (one in each row)
You should have 58 stitches around the entire border of the face
Single crochet through the back loop only in each stitch for 3 rows
Cut working yarn and fasten off

ribbons

Start a new chain of yarn
Chain for 18-20 inches (or to desired ribbon length)
Connect to one of the bottom edges of the bonnet
Slip stitch into each stitch across the entire bottom edge
Chain until second ribbon matches the length of the first
Optional: turn work and slip stitch or single crochet another row to make ribbons thicker
Cut working yarn and fasten off
Weave in all ends



Fingerless Gloves Knitting Pattern

The perfect cute but practical set for winter! Learn how to make this basic pair of fingerless gloves, then go crazy: add bows, colorwork, stripes, a little strand of mohair, whatever you want to bring in your personality!

Materials

- 50g/70m yarn (worsted weight, size 4)
- 6mm circular needles or double pointed needles
- 1 stitch marker
- · tapestry needle
- 4mm crochet hook or other similar size (if adding bows)
- stitch holder (can also use scrap yarn or an extra needle)

Gauge

14 stitches by 18 rows = 4x4 inches/10x10 cm use stockinette stitch on 6mm needles

Video Tutorial

a complete tutorial for the gloves is available on the Material Grrrlz YouTube channel

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Instructions

Body

using 6mm needles, cast on 26 stitches
cast on one extra stitch and use it to close the round
place a stitch marker at the beginning of the row
knit for 12 rows
repeat (knit 5 stitches, make one stitch) up to last 2 stitches, knit 2 stitches
you should now have 30 stitches total
knit for 10 rows
slip 22 stitches onto a stitch holder (or scrap piece of yarn) for later

thumb

you will continue knitting the last 8 stitches in the round to make the thumb hole knit for 4 rows cast off

fingers

place 22 stitches from the stitch holder on 6mm needles using a new piece of yarn, pick up 2 stitches near the thumb hole you should now have 24 total stitches place marker at the beginning of the round knit for 6 rounds cast off weave in all ends

bow

using a 4mm crochet hook, chain for 12 inches/30 cm tie into a bow and use scrap yarn to attach to the glove

Second glove

repeat all steps to create the second glove, but attach the bow to the opposite side of the glove so that it will rest on the top of each hand


