

Scuttle Crochet Pattern

This pattern is written using UK terms!

Quick conversion cheat sheet:

ss=sl st

dc=sc

htr=hdc

tr=dc

Disclaimer: This pattern is likely janky with numerous mistakes. I wrote it down as I did it though, so as long as you follow the general spirit of it you should produce something strongly resembling a Scuttle of your own.



Stuffing and assembly:

I highly recommend stuffing the legs at the end of round 8, and the body starting at round 15 and working through to the end. If your Scuttle looks a little wonky after stuffing it make sure to give it a squish to even things out.

For the best look and secureness use a darning needle and the yarn you used for the main body to attach the pieces to one another.

I used super chunky yarn for my final Scuttle, but this pattern should work for all yarn weights; lighter yarns will produce smaller scuttles obviously, but you can correct this by doubling/quadrupling/etc the numbers in this pattern.

Mane:

Loop yarn around your fingers 2-6 times and cut the tail.

Pull one end of the loops through under a stitch, and slipknot the other end.

Cut the loops and repeat steps until your Scuttle has a full and thick mane.

Body/Head

r1 magic circle dc9 ss to join

r2 ch1, dc, 2dc inc, (dc2, 2dc inc)x2, ss to join (12)

r3 ch1, dc2, 2dc inc, (dc3, 2dc inc)x2, ss to join (15)

r4 ch1, dc3, 2dc inc, (dc4, 2dc inc)x2, ss to join (18)

r5-6 ch1, dc17, ss to join (18)
r7 ch1, dc6, 3dc inc, dc2, 3dc inc, dc7, ss to join (22)
r8 ch1, dc6, 3dc inc, dc6, 3dc inc, dc7, ss to join (26)
r9 ch1, dc6, 3dc inc, dc10, 3dc inc, dc7, ss to join (30)
r10-14 ch1, dc29, ss to join
r15 ch1, dc2tog x14, dc, ss to join
r16 ch1, dc2tog x 7 dc, ss to join
r17 ch1, dc2tog x4, ss to join
r18 ss to close

Legs (6+ as a suggestion, but I ain't a cop)

r1 magic circle, dc7, ss to join (7)
r2-8 ch1, dc6, ss to join
r9 ch1, dc2tog x3, ss to join
r10 ss to close

Ears (make 2)

Disclaimer: These ears have no backing because I couldn't figure out how to make ears with backing in the right shape. Please let me know if you can.

inner ear:

ch7, dc into second chain from hook working into top loops only, htr, tr2, htr, dc then ss along one side to the tip (number of ss varies depending on the yarn you're using, so just do what feels/looks right) I alternated but honestly not sure it made a super big difference.

outer ear:

join yarn to the corner at the base of the ear, then ss along the side towards the tip. Make sure to do 3+ ss at the tip for shape, then chain back down to the other base corner.
